Format & Innovation

Windward – leeward races -  $\frac{1}{2}$  -  $\frac{3}{4}$  mile legs finishing on a beat to line. From leeward marl positioned to leeward of start/Finish line. Starts in pairs 5 minutes apart races approx 45mins per.

Course – in vicinity of Lymington Spit. Similar to previous year.

**Comment:** Interesting to note that the start procedure had not yet introduced the rule that boats should enter the start line from the windward side within 1 minute their 5 minute signal. Thus forcing the prestart duel to be engaged. Boats could at this time still enter very late.
