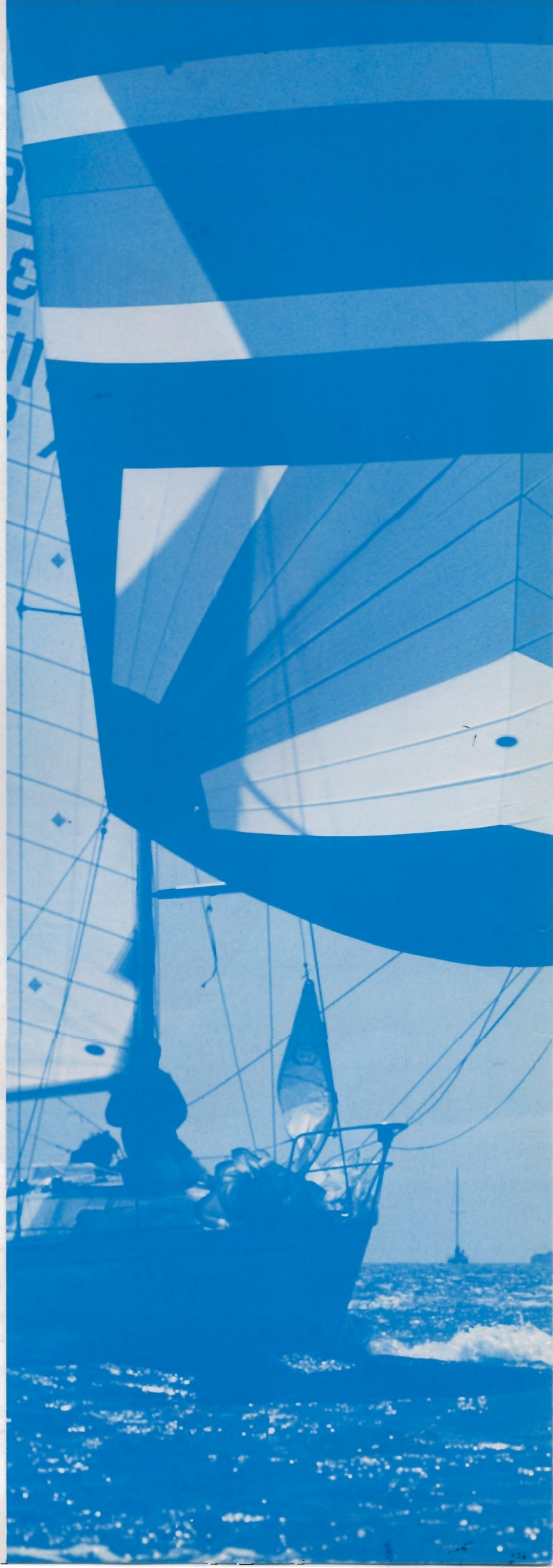

Understanding a match-race

In a match-race, two yachts race against one another, the first home wins and the other loses. The America's Cup event is an example of this type of competition. In a match-race championship like the Long Life Royal Lymington Cup event, a number of yachts race a series of matches against each of the other yachts. Ten yachts are competing for the Long Life Royal Lymington Cup so consequently each yacht will sail nine matches. One point is scored for a win, no points for a second.

Before the start of a match-race competing yachts are assigned to opposite ends of the starting line. When the ten minute signal is given, they are allowed to meet.
