## PEPONNET BEATS WARDEN-OWEN TO WIN ROYAL LYMINGTON CUP

Thierry Peponnet (FRA) sailed away to victory from Eddie Warden-Owen (GBR) with two straight wins on the final of the Royal Lymington Cup today.

In the first race the Frenchman's lead was threatened when he misjudged the tide and hit the windward mark, losing half his lead as he completed his penalty turn - but he held his place. The second race windward leg saw Warden-Owen clawing back on Peponnet's lead but the 12 second downwind gap was enough for Thierry to stay clear.

The semi finals, in more than 20 knots of breeze were incident packed. The Sunsail yachts were tested to the full. Warden-Owen won over Bouet who couldn't recover from two pre-start penalties for contact when he failed to keep clear.

Peponnet raced Bank, and the Frenchman won the first race. In the second race there was a serous incident at the weather mark as Peponnet holed Bank after trying to squeeze through insidebut Bank went on to win the race. In the decider, Bank lost control just above the leeward mark and was carried onto and over the mark, locking it under his rudder and himself into a fourth place sail-off with Bouet, which Bank subsequently won.

The Royal Lymington Cup is the British event of the Omega Grand Prix of Match Race Sailing.

The World Championship takes place in Perth, Australia in September.






# OBSERVERS ROLE TO BE EXTENDED

# TIE NEARLY TOO CLOSE TO BREAK

The closeness of the 93 event caused delay in confirming the fourth semi-finalist, when the "tie" on 9 wins at the end of the second Round Robin between EWO and CLaw had to be broken by referring to the procedure defined in Appendix B6 of the IYRR - involving in a count-back of their results against the higher skippers.

But Chris and Eddie had equal success against all of the top 3! This meant comparing their results to those of 6th place - but Heiner and Pace were "equal" on 8 wins, so their tie had to be broken first by the same process. On this basis, Pace beat Heiner - and by checking Pace's results: Eddie claimed 4th for beating him on the first day of the Regatta.
