		<b>Flag Officers:</b> “shall only serve for 3 years at a time” [An exception to this rule was passed at the AGM in 1926 when Maj. Cyril Potter OBE., Founder and first Commodore of the Club was elected Commodore for life as a mark of appreciation of his invaluable services to the Club.]		
		<b>Annual Subscription:</b> 5 guineas per annum.
