CHALLENGE CUPS AND TROPHIES

HANDICAP CLASS

(Club) The King's Cup

Presented to the R.Y.S. by H.M. King George V in 1925 and won by "Lulworth". Presented to the R.L.Y.C. by Mrs. Lane-Fox (sister of the late H. J. Weld) in July 1937.

Awarded annually to the yacht, owned by a Member of the R.L.Y.C. which obtains the highest number of points in R.O.R.C. races during the season.

(Open) The Saluki Salver

Presented by Major W. M. Martineau, M.C., in 1948.

Awarded annually to the winner of the passage race from Lymington to St. Peter Port. (NO RACE).

(Open) The Parkstone Yacht Club Trophy

Presented by E. A. Philipson, Esq., Commodore of the Parkstone Yacht Club, in 1950.

Awarded annually to the winner of the passage race from Lymington to Poole.

(Open) Passage Race Points Cup

Originally the Sharpie Class Ocean Race Challenge Cup, and re-allocated to the Handicap Class in 1956.

Awarded annually to the yacht gaining the most points in the passage races held early in the season.

(Club) The Potter Ship

Presented by Major Cyril Potter, o.B.E., in 1937.

Awarded annually to the winner of a handicap race for keel boats of over one ton owned and steered by Members of the Club. Interest from an endowment provides prizes for the winning boat of each class.

(Club) The Cadiz Cup

Presented by Thomas Miller, Esq., in 1948.

Awarded annually to the Member who submits the best log of a cruise carried out during the year. Entries judged by a Committee of three Members appointed by the Sailing Committee.

(Open)

The Ware Cup

Presented by Kenneth Moore, Esq., in 1960.

Awarded annually to the winner of a "Cruiser" race for Auxiliary Yachts of 24ft. L.W.L. and over, in which the use of the engine is permitted.

(Open)

The Power Cup

Presented by G. F. C. McL. Power, Esq., in 1947 as a Challenge Cup for a race "Round the Island".

Re-allocated in 1960 and awarded annually to the winner of a Cruiser Race for Auxiliary Yachts of under 24ft. L.W.L. in which the use of the engine is permitted.

(Open)

The Langtry Cup

Presented to the R.L.N. C. S. Major R. E. J. Parsons, M.B.E., in 1964.

Originally won by "Nellie" in the Lymington Regatta of 1872 and now awarded annually to the winner of "Class I" in the R.L.Y.C. Regatta.

(Open)

The Harkaway Cup

Presented by Squadron Commander James Bird in 1933 to the West Solent Restricted Class Club for Team Racing.

Re-allocated in 1965 and awarded annually to the winner of "Class II" in the R.E.Y.C. Regatta.

(Open)

The Bacon Trophy

Presented by Dr. A. Allment in 1967.

Awarded annually to the winner of the Cowes-Lymington Race.

THE "X" ONE DESIGN CLASS

(Club)

The Jade Cup

Presented by G. Beesley, Esq., in 1951.

Awarded annually to the winner of the series of Points Races held on Saturdays.

(Club)

The Hotham Cup

Presented by Licut.-Colonel J. C. Hotham in 1950.

Awarded annually to the winner of the series of Points Races held on Wednesdays.

(Club) The Helmsman's Cup

Presented by O. J. Price, Esq., in 1954.

Awarded annually to the helmsman who gains most points in a series of two races sailed in yachts other than his own and decided by drawing lots.

(Club) The Ladies Cup

Presented by Lieut.-Colonel G. C. G. Gray in 1954.

Awarded annually to the winner of a race steered by a lady who has either steered or crewed at least five times in a Points Race during the current season.

(Open) The Allott Cup

Presented by Mrs. A. Allott as a Points Cup for the "L" Class.

Re-allocated to the "X" Class in 1957.

Awarded annually to the X.O.D. of any Division which gains the most points in any four races for the Class in the Annual Regattas of the R.L.Y.C., R.S.Y.C., Lymington Town and R.A.S.C.Y.C.

(Club) The Single-Handed Cup

Presented by G. P. Senior, Esq., in 1960.

Awarded annually to the winner of a race for yachts sailed single-handed by the owner or a part-owner.

(Club) The Crew's Cup

Presented by the Law Society Yacht Club in 1960.

Awarded annually to the winner of a race steered by a person who has crewed at least three times in Points Races but has not steered in a Points Race.

(Club) The Cock Boat Cup

Presented by Brigadier R. L. Hutchins, M.C., in 1960.

Awarded annually to the yacht which gains the highest average in the Points Races during the season.

(Club) The Marriage Handicap Trophy

Presented by D. E. Taylor, Esq., in 1963.

Awarded annually to the Husband and Wife gaining most points in two races helming and crewing alternately.

(Open) No. 1 Persephone Salver

Presented by Mr. & Mrs. J. Caulcutt in 1967.

Awarded annually to the winner of joint race between Lymington and Yarmouth Divisions, held at Lymington. (No. 2 Salver is raced for at Yarmouth.)

Club) The Dean Maiden Cup

Presented by J. R. Dean, Esq. in 1967.

Originally called "The Consolation Cup" and awarded annually to the winner of a race held for those with no previous flags in the season. Re-allocated and re-named in 1968 and awarded annually to the winner of a race for all "X" poats in Lymington river that have not won a first gun in any race qualifying for the Cock Boat Cup held prior to that date.

INTERNATIONAL FINN CLASS

(Open) West Solent Finn Association Sugar Bowl

Presented by Messrs, Jeremy & Jonathan Rogers in 1957.

Awarded to the winner of the Points Series held at Easter and at Christmas.

(Open) Finn Autumn Trophy

Presented by the West Solent Finn Association in 1959.

Awarded to the winner of a race sailed in the Autumn.

NATIONAL FIREFLY CLASS

(Open) The Solent Salver

Presented by Commander Bertram Jones, R.N., in 1956.

Awarded annually to the winner of a race sailed in the Solent.

(Club) The Coronation Cup

Presented in 1937 as the Flags Cup for Sharpies.

Re-allocated in 1956 as the Coronation Cup for Fireflies.

Awarded annually to the winner of a race sailed during the Summer holidays.

(Open) The Tobin Mugs

Presented by Mrs. Tobin in 1952.

Awarded annually to the winner of the Points Series in the Easter Meeting.

(Open) The Twins Cup

Presented by Adrian and Stuart Jardine in 1953.

Awarded annually to the winner of the Points Series in the Winter Meeting.

The Fortescue Cups (Open)

Presented by R. Fortescue, Esq., in 1957.

Awarded annually to the winner of a series of races for schoolboys or schoolgirls.

(Open) The Cocked Hat Trophy

Presented by A. V. Sainsbury, Esq., in 1968.

Awarded annually to winners of Team Race between Lymington, Parkstone and Christehurch Clubs.

The Richmond Trophy (Open)

Originally awarded for race to Weymouth for Cruisers. Re-allocated in 1965 for Team Racing at the Easter Meeting.

NATIONAL TWELVE FOOT CLASS

(Open) The Solent Plate

Presented in 1954.

Awarded annually to the winner of a race sailed in the Solent, during the Easter Meeting.

(Club) The Coronation Cup

TRANSFRAGED TO Presented by Mrs. Hay in 1956.

Awarded annually to the winner of a race sailed during the summer holidays.

(Open) The Tobin Cup

Presented by Mrs. Tobin in 1952.

Awarded annually to the winner of the Points Series in the Easter Meeting.

(Open) The Twins Cup

Presented by Adrian and Stuart Jardine in 1953.

Awarded annually to the winner of the Points Series in the Winter Meeting.

National FIREFLY CLASS and National TWELVE FOOT CLASS

(Open) The Edmond Trophy

Presented by G. Edmond, Esq., in 1956.

Awarded annually to the winner of a race sailed single-handed in either Class boat.

DINGHY CLASSES UNDER HANDICAP

(Club) The Cock Boat Cup

Originally the Points Cup for Sharpies.

Re-allocated in 1954 as the Dinghy Cock Boat Cup.

Awarded annually to the winner of a series of Points Races held during the summer holidays.

(Club) The Peter Andreae Prize

Dividends from a Trust Investment provide a money prize.

Awarded annually to the winner of a dinghy handicap race for Members under 21 years of age.

BRITISH MOTH CLASS

(Open) The Gozo Boat

Presented by Captain L. A. Whittle in 1947 as a Helmsman's Trophy for Sharpies. Re-allocated in 1962 to the Moth Class.

Awarded annually to the winner of the Moth Class in the Junior Regatta.

ALL DINGHY CLASSES

(Club) The Easter Trophy

Presented by G. P. Senior, Esq., in 1961.

Awarded annually to the Junior Member who puts up the best performance in any Class in the Easter Meeting.

Tar Barrel Trophies

Awarded annually to the boats covering the course from the Club Line to Tar Barrel Post and back in the shortest time. Separate trophies for Finns, Fireflies, G.P.14's and Handicap Class.
