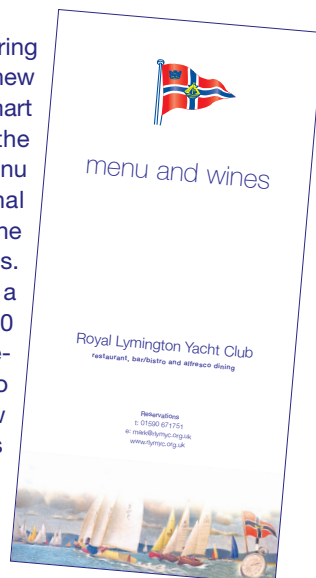
## Winning Weekend

As a result of discussions with the Club's insurers it has been decided that non-members competing in Club organised racing events will be given Temporary Membership of the Club for the duration of the event. In order to clarify and confirm this policy, the General Committee has agreed to a change to the wording of Club

Regulation 9, which now reads as follows:

### 9. Competitors in Club Races

*Any person who is a competitor or crew member in any race organised by or on behalf of the Club shall be a Temporary Member of the Club for the duration of the race and the associated event. The Club reserves the right to exclude a competitor or crew member from the Club or refuse Temporary Membership without explanation.*

### Youth and Juniors

#### Lymington 420 sailors

Phil Sparks and his crew Ben Gratton finished top in the recent British World and European Selection events and will represent GBR at both the 420 World Championships in Italy and the Junior European Championships in Hungary. Phil has a busy summer as he will be GBR's 420 representative at the ISAF Youth Worlds in Brazil.

Andrew Wishart and Liam Garrison finished in a very creditable 15th place overall (10th in boys fleet) and Molly Bridge and Pip Weguelin finished 25th overall (10th in girls fleet). Both were only three places off selection to the Worlds team. Andrew and Liam have only been racing 420 for a year since moving up from Optimists in spring 2008.

#### Laser Radial

After the three Laser Radial National Qualifiers, Hannah Snellgrove was ranked 3rd Lady and qualified to represent GBR in the European Championships to be held in Denmark and the World Championships in Japan.
