Cruising Meets

Details of the Spring Anchor meet in Poole Harbour on Friday 14th to Sunday 16th May are on the Cruising website and on the Club notice board.

Details of the June Meet to St Peter Port on Friday 11th to Sunday 13th June are on the Cruising website and will be posted on the Club notice board shortly. For those of us stopping at Cherbourg en route to Guernsey, the plan is to meet up for dinner in a local restaurant on Thursday 10th June before moving on to St Peter Port the following day. Further details will follow. Tides are good on Friday for leaving Cherbourg at a socially acceptable hour. The deadline for registration is 27th May but early indication of total boat and crew numbers would be helpful. So please put your name on the list at the Club as soon as possible and/or email_Ken Claydon if you wish to attend and whether you will be stopping off at Cherbourg.

In July the meet will be at Cowes on the weekend of Friday 16th to Sunday 18th, to coincide with the Victorian Opera Evening at Osborne House on Saturday. Berthing at East Cowes Marina has been arranged for Friday night and those intending to go should make their own bookings for berthing on Saturday night and for tickets for the evening. Details and contact telephone numbers are on the Cruising website and on the Club notice board. Please add your details to the list on the notice board so that Friday night berthing can be finalised, together with arrangements for transport from the marina to Osborne House.

The August Meet on Friday 20th to Sunday 22nd will be to the West Country. Details are being finalised over the next few days, but the intention is that the focus of the meet will be at either Plymouth or Fowey, subject to confirmation of arrangements for dinner on Saturday and availability of berthing.

French West Coast Update after the Spring Storms

Peter Lowe reports that the spring storm has closed several marinas on the West Coast of France to visitors. He recently took his boat to Pauillac and found that the pontoons at Dielette are nearing completion of repairs (according to notice in Trebeurden); the west wave barrier at L'Aberwrac'h is out of use for an unkown period, very limited alternative visitor berth on east inner near commercial fuel (personal observation and conversation with HM); the main marina at Sables d'Olonne is totally closed for "some months". He recommends that anyone going to the French west coast should check a few days in advance, as delays in settling insurance and in finding sufficient new pontoons/modifying piling may mean that not all are back to normal by high season.

Calling all Keelboat skippers and potential crews

Last year the Club ran a very successful keelboat training scheme for youngsters. Most of the youngsters who took part last year now race regularly on Thursday evenings.

A very successful day of training was recently held at the Club to introduce the next group of youngsters to Keelboat Racing. Seven enthusiastic 15 & 16 year-olds spent a day learning how to handle ropes and winches safely and what the various jobs around the boat involve. They then had several hours on the water putting their training into action. The next stage of the process is to find them crew slots on Keelboats on Thursday evenings for further training and experience. I would be very pleased to hear from any skipper who feels that they could take one or two youngsters on board and help to give them some practical racing experience.



In addition to this we are hoping to run some further training this summer; another session for beginners and hopefully some more advanced training for those who did their beginner training last year and this spring. This could be on a Saturday or Sunday, or on a Wednesday evening. To do this we need skippers who would be willing to bring their boats and take part in the training session. Bob Baker and Robin Taunt have kindly helped with this before; if anyone else is interested in being involved, I would be delighted to hear from them. It does mean that you have the pick of the trainees if you need crew.

I would also like to hear from any youngsters interested in taking part in this scheme; it is a great way to get involved in the racing and associated social scene.

RS Elite Class Update

With the whole fleet overlapped at the first mark on both of the Spring Series races so far, 2010 RS Elite racing at Lymington is definitely under way. We've got some new faces and loads of Elite racing in store this

summer. The highlight will be the UK National Championships on home turf, hosted by the Club. Just about the whole fleet is involved in the preparation and ten races are scheduled from 22nd to 25th July in Christchurch Bay, where around thirty boats from England, Ireland, Scotland, the Channel Islands (and Cornwall) will compete. New Elite owner Roger Wilson has agreed to be our PRO so we can be pretty certain that the flags will flap in the right order. Shaun McClean and his team from Edinburgh are coming to defend their title. Time is also being spent on the social programme so get a RS Elite and join the fun.

After the Nationals conclude there will be just five days to recover and then it's off to Cowes. Several of the Nationals visitors plan to leave their boats in

Lymington and sail up to Cowes with our fleet so we can expect added competition within the Elite Class there too.

West Solent Series

If you are interested in racing a yacht without the intensity of One Design Racing or the seriousness of IRC racing and you like to have some fun, then the West Solent series would be a good place to start or end your racing career - it may be the best option for you regardless of experience as the handicap system takes into account each competitor's performance, so in theory giving everybody a chance to do well.

This new Series is supported and promoted by the RLymYC, RSYC and LTSC. The races are open to anybody - the aim is to maximize participation - yachts which are not entered by a member of one of the three Clubs will pay an entry fee of £10 per race. All other yachts will have free entry except for the Turkey Cup where the entry fee is £10 per boat.

Lymington 420s success at RYA Youth National Championships

This year's Championships at Weymouth saw variable conditions throughout the week and some exciting sailing. Winds up to 25 knots from the south east with strong gusts greeted the 420s for their first day at the exposed eastern end of Weymouth Bay; the crews of Dibb/Cox (11th and 19th) and Gill-Taylor/Wallis (10th both races) had excellent results. Some rushed overnight repairs saw the arrival of HRH Princess Anne, who took to the water in sunshine to watch the racing. The conditions continued to improve for the rest of the week.

Overall our Lymington 420 sailors did extremely well as it was their first Youth Championships for most of them.

Craig Dibb and Charlie Cox finished 7th being 2nd overall for their age and ending the championships with a bullet in the last race They are currently on track to be at this year's 420 Worlds to be held in Haifa, Israel and the Junior European Championship at La Rochelle, France.

Tarra Gill-Taylor and Matt Wallis are also likely to gain a place at the Worlds.

Lymington Laser Youth Sailors earn their place for Youth Radial World Championships

The Club Youth Radial Laser sailors have been training hard this winter with their coach, Ben Paton, 2007 Radial World Champion. Tom Britz (7th), Olly Porter (14th) and Robbie Urwin (16th) have qualified for a place at the World Championships in Largs, Scotland following three qualifier weekends and the Youth National Championships in Weymouth during Easter week. Katie Russell (10th Woman) and

Charlotte Alderton (14th Woman) have a place in the Women's Radial Laser World Championship. Other Club member results at Youth Nationals were for Jamie Diamond who qualified for the gold fleet and Karen Thomas who was competing in her first Radial regatta.

The qualifying series has been a mix of conditions from very light to strong winds in Plymouth and the beginning of the Youth Nationals. Tom Britz, current junior European Laser Champion gained some excellent results in this, his first Radial qualifying series. The Youth National Championships in Weymouth were also the indicator and selections for the National Youth squad and ISAF World Championship in Turkey. The introduction at Weymouth of the tracker device carried by each boat showed real time progress on the water and provided endless hours of post racing analysis. This innovation proved very distracting for many parents watching their



internet at work and home during the day. Tom has retained his place in the National Youth Radial squad. Olly Porter and Robbie Urwin had a close series and even closer in the Youth Nationals, finishing 16 and 17th respectively. The current squad at Lymington have a growing group of young sailors in Radial and 4.7 junior classes and train regularly for the national events.



Lymington Optimists

Optimist dinghies started their summer race training last weekend. 18 new sailors joined the river fleet and a further 18 began training at the Salterns, bringing enthusiasm and a great sense of wonder as to how they will develop their skills over the next few months, and where these new found skills might eventually take them. Monday evening racing for the more experienced sailors started too, with 12 well tuned oppies battling it out into the setting sun. Immaculate boat handling and lightning speed gave Mimi El-Khazindar the win, just ahead of Sarah Jarman and Max Moyles. But with a further 8 races to go in this early series, it will be a closely fought contest.
