The 3rd and final Selection Event is combined this year with the RYA Youth Championships from the 1st to 6th April in North Wales at Pwllheli Yacht Club, 14 scheduled races will decided 420 Youth Champions, ISAF Male and Female representatives, the seven boats to compete in Junior Europeans, and the 14 boats to compete in World Championships. Spring arrived just on time for the Spring Championships in Poole Harbour. "The tide always seemed to be against us upwind," said Mimi El-Khazindar (pictured left). "It was like you were being pulled backwards by a giant, unstoppable carpet. The key was to find the paths of least resistance, in the shallower water." The wind was barely enough to make against the tide, and any sailor who got into dirty air or a channel would go backwards almost immediately. Millie Boyle read the conditions best so came in a staggering 3rd overall. With Worlds Team Selection coming up in May, this outstandingly talented 12year old will be one to watch. Last year our top sailor (who was also the first girl) came 14th; this year we had 5 girls in the top 14, and 19 sailors in the top 40 (last year only 5). But the glory wasn't the preserve of the superstars; Jonah Rogers, William Butler and Tobias Schonrock received trophies for their exertions in the Silver Fleet. It's important to recognise those

who don't get so many opportunities to sail, yet pitch themselves into the cauldron of a major event and cheerfully – and bravely – chip away at the fleet.

The following weekend marked the last of the winter Squad training; Team Racing for South Zone at Calshot, and a joint session for National and Intermediate Squads in Weymouth. This culminated in some ferocious racing, with Intermediate Squad sailors – who have been superbly trained this winter by Greek National Coach Atzeman Vagelis – keen to scalp a few of the National Squad, who were very much on home territory.

Robbie King was the 3rd placed National Squad sailor, with Pippa Cropley first girl in 5th place (she had also come 5th in the Spring Champs, so proved this was no fluke.) Prizes were also awarded to George Ford (2nd placed Int squad sailor), and Vita Heathcote (1st girl).

An impressive 64 Oppie sailors – all Members of the Club – turned out for the final winter training weekend in Lymington. These immensely successful weekends are run by Oppie legend Matt Rainback and his team of coaches, and all abilities are welcome. Sailors train in their groups all morning and meet up for joint racing in the afternoon from the Club committee boat 'We're Here'. The girls hogged the podium with Millie Boyle (1st), Pippa Cropley (2nd) and Mimi El-Khazindar (3rd) all hitting top form, just in time for the forthcoming racing season. Matt Thornton (4th) was first boy; Charlotte Boyle (7th) first non National Squad; and Hayden Sewell (14th) first non squad.
