In order to qualify for inclusion the following information is required:-Name(s)

- Name of Boat, type, length, draft.
- Date of start and port
- Route
- Date of completion and port

The criteria for the completion of a circumnavigation of the world is: to have crossed the equator at least twice and all lines of longitude during the voyage.

Please submit the above information, together with anything else that you may feel relevant, to the Captain of Cruising before 30<sup>th</sup> April 2016. An interim board will be displayed in the Club for three months after which a permanent board will be made. It will therefore be possible for late submissions to be accepted only whilst the interim board is displayed.
