Ken Kershaw has recently received a World Sailing Gold Medal, to recognise his work on safety with the Special Regulations, IOS International Standards for Recreational Craft and the foundation and development of the Equipment Rules of Sailing together with its offsprings the Standard Class Rules and Manufacturer In-house Certification.

Only 64 World Sailing Gold Medals have been awarded since its introduction in 1990 with nine of these going to Brits. Recipients are either retiring members of the Executive Committee, long-serving chairmen of World Sailing Committees who have made a significant contribution to the work of World Sailing or, as in Ken's award, "individuals who have contributed to the development of World Sailing in a remarkable way".

We are also starting European language classes for sailors, initially Spanish classes, with Laura teaching so watch out for the posters.


We are thinking of setting up a Saturday morning Breakfast Club, probably monthly initially, but driven by whatever members want. Anyone interested please let Gillian or me know.
