The Annual Cruising Dinner is taking place on Saturday 25th February with entertainment on the evening by award winning magician Richard Young. Tickets are £31.


#### Movie Nights:


Hot food will be available from 18:30hrs and served before the film starts at 20:00.


Thursday 09th February - In the Heart of the Sea

#### Summer Cruise 2017

This is preliminary notice of the cruising section's plans for this year's summer cruise incorporating initial thinking.

As discussed at the cruising forum in October and following positive feedback from participants in last year's event the cruise will continue the informal format adopted over recent years. There will be no fixed passage plan but everyone who signs up will be kept up to date with 'fleet' movements by a daily text message from mid-June until mid-July to facilitate ad hoc meets in a wide variety of locations. The main changes, based on the feedback from the Forum and the experience of the past couple of years will be:



• The option of cruising across the Channel "in company" to support those who are less experienced or confident of making the

journey. Depending on the wind and weather, we would aim to either cross to Cherbourg or Alderney. This would be followed by cruising in the Channel Islands and the North Brittany coast. The extent of "in company" support has yet to be finalised but could include sailing within sight of other boats, maintaining VHF contact and leaving the dock together as well as early arrivers helping the later ones moor up.

• There will be no fixed dinners other than the cruise supper at the club. Instead, dinners at local restaurants will be organised depending on the number of boats in the same location. For those wanting to cruise "in company", dinners will be organised at the time. For example, there could be a dinner in Cherbourg on day 3 if the initial destination is to that port.

This year the cruise will start with a pre cruise supper at the club on Friday 9th June. In view of the flexible nature of the cruise there will be no deadline for signing up although we will need to firm up on numbers for the cruising in company nearer the time. That said early expressions of interest by email to me would be appreciated. If this can include information on your likely cruising area so much the better. Also, if you have any ideas or proposals for the cruise, please let me know.

#### Trip Report - Newtown Harbour 17 Jan 2017

The first day sail of 2017 ventured to the New Inn at Shallfleet. Weather conditions were benign with a light south westerly wind and light cloud cover tempting some 80 Members and guests to brave the crisp January morning. Good progress was made on the flood and nearly all participants arrived by 11:15. Whilst the keelboats made fast to buoys the smaller motor boats were able to navigate to the quay on the rising tide. This greatly eased the work of the RIB drivers ferrying crews ashore and we thank the skippers for their willing participation.

All 80 people made the trip down the lane to the Inn without incident. The Club in fact completely filled the tables in every area. The steak and fish pie on offer was not only excellent fare but good value at only £10 per head.

Suitably fortified, at about 13:30 we wended our way back to the quay and the return to the boats at their moorings. This was accomplished without incident by 14:30 and the nineteen participating boats made their way back to Lymington on the strengthening ebb in glorious sunshine.

The day was notable for its jollity and high spirits as the winter blues gently breezed away.

#### XOD

The XOD fleet at Lymington is one of 6 Solent clubs that race X's, culminating, if one wishes, in racing at Cowes week and Cowes Classic Week and lots of Solent racing as well. An XOD could take part in over 80 races a season if the owner was willing!

We are a very competitive fleet but extremely welcoming to newcomers, be they transitioning from other boats or perhaps new to the area. We have sailors of all ages, from youth sailors who really enjoy the competitive close tactical racing that is similar to their one design dinghies, to older sailors who just want to improve and learn from the vast experience in the class. Our experienced sailors will help you with setting up your boat and getting up to speed quickly.

There are 38 X boats at Lymington (not all on the water at the same time) and we all race together on Saturday and Wednesday afternoons when we have a dedicated start at 14:00 and also on Thursday evenings when we join in with the rest of the club racing. We typically see between 15 to 25 Xs racing on Saturdays and Wednesdays.

"The standard of racing is high with a number of ex Olympians and world champions taking part and it normally takes mere mortals a little time to get to the front. However, it's a great way to learn especially when the top guys are so helpful!"
