Sandwiches & cold eats will be available at lunch time but there will be no food offering on Tuesday evening.



He is now completing the third part of a Mark Twain travel trilogy *Heart of Lightness, Mark Twain's Mississippi Revisited*, Ian has been a trustee and director of the National Motor Museum in Beaulieu. He is chairman of Unicorn Publishing Group, chairman of Sophie Macpherson Ltd, a fine arts recruitment company, chairman of Play Associates Ltd., an interior design company, and a director of Art World Alliance Ltd. He is also a civil and commercial mediator with the Civil Mediation Council. He has previously talked at the Clun about his biography of Sir Francis Chichester, *Never Fear: Reliving the Life of Sir Francis Chichester;* and has recently published his art book about the painter Sophie Walbeoffe, *Painting with Both Hands*. A keen cruising sailor he is a Yachtmaster Instructor and member of the Royal Yacht Squadron and Royal Cruising Club.v

The 17th annual Lymington Lifeboat 10K and Children's Fun Run events are now open for entries



For 2018 the event will again include last year's popular under 5 yrs run thus enabling all the family to participate. The 10K is open for entrants from 15 upwards and the Children's Run age groups are 0 - 5 yrs, 5 - 8 yrs, 9 - 11 yrs and 12 - 15 yrs, allowing 15 year olds to either compete at 2K for the Inter-school team shield or at 10K.

Dubbed by the organisers as the "Run in the Sun" as they've only had two really wet days in the events history, the 10K route follows quiet country lanes and tracks towards Keyhaven before turning back via the sea wall and Oxey Barn. For the children, one or two laps of a range of measured courses within the confines of Woodside Park provide the distances.
