



# Cruising

#### New Year Mid Week Cruise - Newtown Harbour - Thursday 18 January 2018

The opening event of 2018 is a short daytime cruise to Newtown Harbour on the Isle of Wight with lunch at the New Inn at Shalfleet, and a transit time of an hour or less. Boats attending can moor at the buoys laid in the harbour or anchor. Club RIBs will assist in ferrying crews ashore to the jetty at Shalfleet Quay Boatyard, with a 15 minute walk to the New Inn, which is well known for its food.

Lunch will be available from 1215. There will be a choice of either steak or fish pie at a price of £10. Please make your selection on the list. The list for the event is below and will close at 1200 on Monday 15 January, so that numbers and requirements can be passed to the New Inn and contingency plans made in the event of bad weather. The Wight Link Ferry sailings to Yarmouth are scheduled at 1000 and 1100.

The Harbour Master allows rafting on the buoys in settled conditions and Members are asked to buddy up on each buoy if the weather is suitable. Mooring charges will be collected by the HM.

Return transfers from shore to boats will commence at 1400 to enable adequate time to clear the harbour on the falling tide and return to Lymington in daylight (Sunset 1631). It is predicted that the height of tide will fall to 2.2m by about 1500 allowing sufficient water for a safe exit. It is planned for the RIBs to depart no later than 1530 to assist in recovering crews from moorings at Lymington.

There will be a briefing at the Club at 0900 to update any changes to the plan, especially in the light of the weather on the day, and allocate any spare crew to vessels.

# Training First Aid Course

The Club is running First Aid Course on the following dates:

- Sunday 14th January
- Saturday 17th February

The course runs from 09:00hrs to 16:30 approx. in the Island Room.

#### COURSE INFORMATION

Our one-day course covers all the usual first aid subjects, but from a boating perspective. It is aimed at anyone who goes afloat, whether on inland waters, rivers, estuaries or on cross channel passages.

In a medical emergency a little first aid knowledge and immediate action can save lives, especially in remote locations. This one-day course is designed to provide a working knowledge of first aid for people using small craft and to support skippers.

It fulfils the requirements for: professional skippers of small craft working within 60 miles of a safe haven, including Boat masters; the Senior First Aid certificate needed by offshore racers subject to ISAF's regulations on first aid training (OSR 4.08.4). The course is recommended by the MCA and HSE.

The subjects specific to boating include:

- the recovery position in a confined space
- CPR, including the drowning protocol
- cold shock and hypothermia from immersion and/or exposure
- seasickness and dehydration
- medical assistance or advice by VHF
- helicopter rescue

To book onto a course you will need to fill in the application form and return it to the Club along with your payment. The course is £50 for Members and £70 for non-Members.

# Mark Laying Course (£45 to all)

• 17th & 18th March 2018

This two-day very hands on course will provide you with the skill & knowledge of how to correctly set and lay marks for all types of courses. This course is both afloat and classroom based.

## Dinghies

This year's Penguin Trophy was sailed in very light breezes of between 5 and 10 knots in the Lymington River, opposite the clubhouse, in Scows kindly lent by Wednesday Junior Sailing. The traditional mulled wine and mince pies fortified both sailors and spectators in the chilly morning of 28<sup>th</sup> December. With a strong ebb tide bolstered by the recent rain, it was fortunate that there is no penalty for touching marks as there were several hotly contested mark roundings in this very competitive fleet. The various Olympic squad sailors, national and European champions and other Club members hoping for a chance at this coveted silver trophy ranged in age from seven to seventy-something. Some had selected very small light wind crews but expert jib trimming and tactical input from the more experienced crews proved advantageous as the youngest crews focussed more on their provisions. Race Officer Vince Sutherland and his team did a great job to get seven races in despite the light conditions. The first flight was sailed in almost no wind, making it very difficult to beat against the tide. After three two-race heats the top six went through to a two-lap final race, won by Luke & Emma McEwen with 2nd Henry Lloyd Williams & Hannah Froud, 3rd Jeremy & Max Vines, 4th Connie Stock & Ollie Porter, 5th Ollie Tait & Alice Wood, 6th Dominic & Charlotte Patten.



The Peter Andreae Trophy is sailed each year by members of the Club who are under 21, also in WJS Scows, for cash prizes. As the wind on 27th December was gusting to 40 kts with an average wind speed of 28 kts Race Officer Stuart Jardine prudently postponed this year's event and ran it after the Penguin Trophy on the 28th. After two tricky laps in the same light winds and strong current that had troubled the Penguin Trophy competitors, the winners were Cameron Bignold-Kyles & Lola Mordaunt, who went home with an envelope of shiny coins and the Peter Andreae Trophy, a beautiful silver model of a dinghy. Second were Emma & Alex Breese, third Ollie Tait & Alice Wood and fourth Hannah Froud & Sienna Mordaunt.
