



## **Racing**

### Summer Regatta 14<sup>th</sup> and 15th June

IRC rated boats have two races on Saturday afternoon and one on Sunday morning and the Lymington Handicap fleets, XODs and Folkboats have one each day run from the Platform. The lead sponsor for this year's regatta will be Spencers of the New Forest. Continued support from Danebury Vineyards and prizes from Dubarry and Harken complete the list of supporters.

#### Captain of Racing's Round Up

Racing is now in full swing. Once again we are running what are effectively two major regattas each week. On Mondays we have up to 50 boats out racing in 5 fleets; on Thursdays we now have just over 100 keelboats entered to race over 7 fleets. The weather has not been particularly cooperative so far this year and it has been a real challenge for our race teams to achieve finishes. Sometimes we don't make it, but most of the time everyone scores a finish as the breeze dies away.

Saturday racing for XODs and Folkboats is a long established tradition. In recent years we have added the Duo series for Cruiser Racers. In the second of the series, raced last Saturday, fourteen boats came to the start line in very light and tricky conditions for a race which eventually lasted well over 5 hours. It was good to see the young team of Fergus Roper and Rupert Houlton, on the borrowed *Jibe*, win IRC1 by a margin of 45 minutes on corrected time.

The previous Saturday it had been the turn of the fully crewed Cruiser Racers for the first race of this season in their series, scored under Lymington Handicap. The early morning wind was deemed too strong to send the smaller boats out into Christchurch Bay without support, so courses for both Classes were set in the Solent, and completed successfully as the wind eased considerably during the day. The nine boats taking part thoroughly enjoyed the relaxed Club racing and we are expecting the enthusiasm to be contagious as entries increase for the next round on July 12<sup>th</sup>.

The Summer Regatta and Ball, will take all our attention. Full details are above, so get your crew organised for racing and partying.

### **Sappers 'barbecued'**

The Club hosted the Royal Engineers Yacht Club annual regatta on Saturday 17<sup>th</sup> May. Seven boats visited the river accompanied by some 50 crew, race officials and supporters. The event consisted of two races in two classes for the REYC yachts and a special team race against the RLymYC for the Carlier Trophy, which last year was won by the Sappers. Morning racing was disrupted by calm winds and strong tides but a sea breeze kicked in for the afternoon races. The Club team was headed by Peter Scholfield's HOD35 *Zarafa* with Richard Jenner's Elan336 *Bonni Lady* and Allan Hill's J30 *Colleen*. The REYC were represented by the X332 Ilex of *Upnor*, Dehler 32 *Right Royal* and Contessa 32 *Gualin*.



Boats motoring out for the afternoon start were met by the REYC's 52ft Little Harbor yacht *Robin of Cowes* anchored up enjoying a BBQ with chef in 'appropriate' outfit and crew sizzling on deck in the glorious weather. There was a mass start for all classes with the Lymington boats getting away the better. The REYC's *Gualin* must have been distracted by the aroma of grilled burgers as it got the wrong side of the line during the start sequence and had to sail back against the tide. *Zarafa* was first round the windward mark followed by llex of *Upnor* and *Bonni Lady*. On the downwind leg into the tide the Lymington boats showed their experience of local waters by gybing hard in against the mainland shore. On IRC corrected time *Zarafa* was declared the winner with *Gaulin* second, *Bonni Lady* third and *Colleen* fourth followed by Right Royal and Ilex of Upnor. This gave the Club team the Carlier Trophy by 8 pts to 13. One problem, the Sappers were so confident of victory that they forgot to bring the Trophy with them! After the racing a lively reception was held on the Club balcony.

Johnny Thompson (24<sup>th</sup>) will go to Flanders.

The lucky chap had been invited to the International Friendship All Japan Regatta, held on the water to be used for the 2020 Olympics. The following weekend, Zac again took to the stage at a very blustery ET inter-Zone Championships at Rutland Water and came in 3<sup>rd</sup>.

We then all reconvened for the Inland Championships at a very sunny Grafham water. Of the 210 sailors in the mainfleet, William Heathcote (3<sup>rd</sup>) got the better of the patchy conditions with Milly Boyle (10<sup>th</sup>), Vita Heathcote (11<sup>th</sup>) and Ella Bennett (12<sup>th</sup>) all having some good races too. Fellow Club members Sam de la Feuillade (1<sup>st</sup>), Amos Sopher (3<sup>rd</sup>) and Santi Sesto (5<sup>th</sup>) dominated the regatta fleet and proved that we have no end of emerging talent.
