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# Club

### **Annual General Meeting**

The Club's Annual General Meeting was held on 11<sup>th</sup> February and was attended by over 350 Members. This number significantly exceeding that expected and, as a result, non-voting Family members had to follow the proceedings by screens set up in the River Room.

There was clearly strong interest in the Member's resolution (4) proposing that our subscriptions be initially maintained and that a system of fair charging for the use of the waterside facilities be introduced. After many contributions from the floor the polled votes were collected and the result was that the resolution was rejected.

The second Member's resolution to allow dogs on to the balcony again drew many comments from the floor but again the polled votes rejected this change to Regulation 21.

The Special Resolution, a change to Article 13.1 which would allow time spent as a Provisional Member to be included in the qualification period to be eligible for election to office was passed.

All other statutory resolutions were passed. The 2017 Handbook will be issued shortly which include the amended Article 13.1. The minutes of the AGM will be issued in due course.

## Movie Nights:


