## Hannah Snellgrove - Crowdfunding appeal.



Hannah is three-time British Laser Radial National Champion. She rose up through the Club's youth programme, initially in Optimists, then Laser 4.7s; finally making the move into the Laser Radial, the women's single-handed Olympic class, in her teens.

She is making a return to the Olympic sailing circuit after a two year break from international competition, during which time she has coached and helped to build up the RS Tera and Laser youth programmes at the Club.

A self-supported sailor since April 2015, she receives no funding from the RYA. She is searching for financial backing to be able to compete against the professional athletes who are supported by their national governing bodies.

In addition to Hannah's three national titles, she has been placed in the top 10 at European level, EUROSAF Cups and World Cups and in the top 15 at a World Championship. She was inspired to recommence her campaign at the Worlds and

Europeans last year, while working full time and with very little to no time in the boat, she finished 26<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> respectively, with multiple top 10 race finishes in both major regattas.

Hannah has launched a crowd funding project to secure a new Laser Radial and spares to facilitate her sailing for the upcoming season. Full details of the project and how to donate can be found by following this [link](#).
