# MCZs - The role of the Marine Management Organisation - Wednesday 8th October 18:30

Clare Kavanah from the Marine Management Organisation (MMO) will outline the overall role of the MMO, the way that the national plans are developed, how they will impact on recreational sailors and how, we as citizens, can influence them. Members will be aware of the efforts being undertaken by both the RYA Southern Region and the Club to ensure that whilst the marine environment is preserved there are no unnecessary restrictions imposed on recreational sailors.

There are a number of proposals relating to marine planning in our area which have raised concern amongst recreational sailors. These proposals include Marine Conservation Zones and the Navitus Bay Wind Farm. They are however only one part of MMO's planning process which is intended to develop a twenty year marine plan for the South of England. All these plans have to fit into a framework of marine development covering all marine activity in our territorial waters.

Please come if you can. Desmond Swayne, MP, takes an active interest and it is important that we show the MMO and the politicians that we care about our marine environment.



## **Racing**

## Captain of Racing's Round Up

What makes a racing sailor happy? Good courses, close competition, sunshine, warm water: we had all

these throughout this stunning month. Just one ingredient missing, which slightly marred the best September I can remember: little wind. Some races in our regular series had to be abandoned, but glorious conditions on other days made up for the occasional disappointment.

The J/109 and J/105 fleets visited on the first weekend and enjoyed fantastic racing in Christchurch Bay on the Saturday, when the Solent was becalmed. Sadly, the whispers of breeze in the Solent on Sunday morning were insufficient for racing. Nevertheless, the event was deemed a success by the visitors and the First Floor managed magnificently with a big crowd on the Saturday evening as we joined the visiting Solent Old Gaffers Association on the balcony.

The Classics Regatta on the following weekend is a new event, which we hope to develop into a regular stop on the Classics' circuit. Again, the wind on Saturday was less than ideal to get these heavier boats moving, but the race programme was completed to general satisfaction.

On the Saturday of the third weekend, the keelboats set out for their long race west. The 'race' was more of a drift down the Needles Channel with the tide and back via North Head, also with the tide. So most boats finished and had a good time, demonstrating, for a change, that tidal flows can help an event when the wind is not doing its job.

The Club turned out in force for Bart's Bash on the Sunday with race officer Ken Hay sending the keelboat fleet downwind on a northerly to the Island shore. The dinghies had a tougher time, with long journeys to their starting area well west of the river, and back again in the building breeze. The support of this event from the racing community in Lymington was generous and worthy of a great sailor. We now hear that it is intended to repeat the event next September and it will interesting to see if that idea is generally favoured.

Looking towards October and our racing season reaches its climax with the Pottership race on Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> October, when every keelboat is invited for a mass start at the Platform and a fight to win the magnificent Pottership Trophy, which you cannot fail to see in its case at the bar.

The following Saturday, October 11<sup>th</sup>, sees the Champion of Champions race, followed by the annual Prize Giving Party when we meet to celebrate another fine racing season at Lymington.

Meanwhile Pottering continued with an average turnout of 12-14 boats every Thursday. On 30th September the first of the Tuesday Potters took place with just 6 boats enjoying perfect conditions, a warm breeze, a calm sea and very little traffic in the river either way. The fleet will be running two Potters each week from now until 30th October, weather permitting. Why not come along at 10.00 and join in the fun.

### **Oppie News**

September is always a busy month as we try to cash in on the warm water, Indian summer and a multitude of regattas. We could have done with a little more breeze though...

The UK's top 24 sailors descended upon Lymington for their Summer Squad training weekend, led by National Coach Alan Williams. Lymington has been the focus of much training for the Worlds Team who will be off to Argentina next month, as the short chop that we get here is also typical of the waters north of

Buenos Aires where the championships will be held.

Spinnaker Open attracted an entry of 84 sailors for the main fleet alone. Haydn Sewell won the event followed by fellow Lymington sailors Hattie Rogers (2<sup>nd</sup>), Oliver Dowson-McGill (4<sup>th</sup>), Alex Schonrock (5<sup>th</sup>) and Zac West (7<sup>th</sup>).

The Worlds Team headed east to the Baltic for the Polish Optimist Championships at Kamien Pomorski, which will be hosting the World Championships next year. 437 sailors showed up, with most other European Worlds teams amongst them. Generally the GBRs picked up too many flags but did at least get all of their mistakes out of the way! Vita came back with a bag full of prizes so they were not as shabby as they feared.

The same weekend was the Belgian Open Championships. Lymington managed to squeeze four sailors into the top 10: Arthur Fry (3<sup>rd</sup>), Julia Mellers (5<sup>th</sup>), Sophie Holloway (7<sup>th</sup>) and Oli Hill (10<sup>th</sup>)

There was a great exodus from the balance pond to Weymouth for the South Zone and Home Counties Championships the following weekend. This is the main selection trials for the RYA South Zone, a winter training squad of 24, and is really the first rung of the ladder of what is called the RYA's "Olympic Pathway". 92 sailors did their best not to get too bored and frustrated in 4-6 knots of dying breeze. Haydn Sewell (2<sup>nd</sup>), Arthur Fry (3<sup>rd</sup>), William Heathcote (4<sup>th</sup>), Calum Cook (9<sup>th</sup>) all just about held it together, and mention should be made of the rise Oliver Dowson McGill (11<sup>th</sup>) against such a strong fleet.
