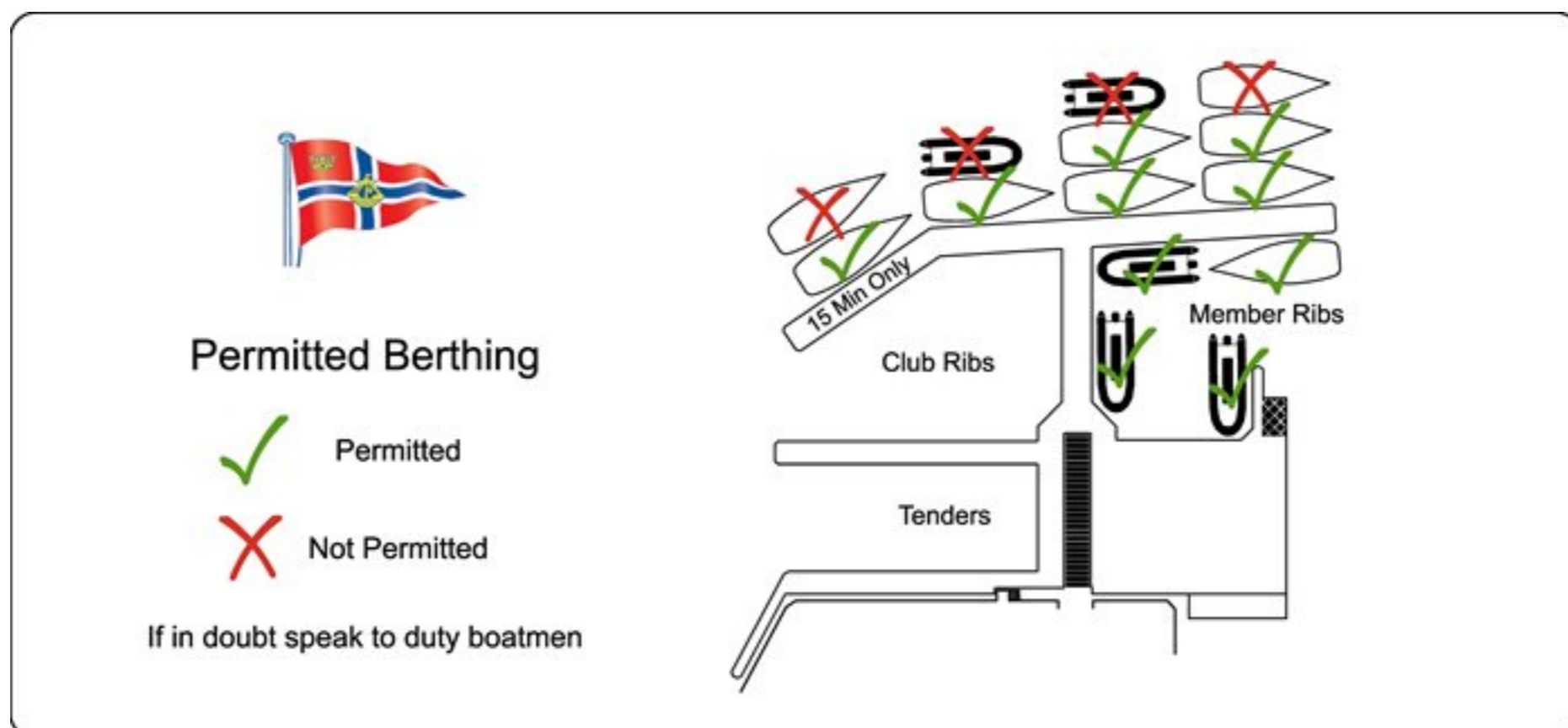
#### Pontoon

After 6 months experience of the new pontoons, most users seem to have enjoyed the extra space and flexibility they offer. The new layout seems to be working well, and generally Members have complied with the berthing limitations. As it is a condition of our licence with the Harbour Commissioners that we comply, may I remind Members:

Please do not berth more than **two** yachts abreast (no Ribs) on the main (river) pontoon, and not more than one at the north end, or on the 15 minute berth, which itself must be vacated strictly within 15 minutes.

The south basin is available to Members for berthing yachts and RIBs, rafted if necessary.

**Always contact the boatmen when berthing during working hours, and at 0800 in the morning if berthing outside working hours**

## Reminder - Consultation on Town Quay Mooring Redevelopment Proposals ends 25<sup>th</sup> September

Lymington Harbour Commissioners (LHC) would like your views on its proposals to redevelop the Town Quay area to meet the changing market requirements for more walk ashore visitor berths. The proposal to redevelop Town Quay was first incorporated into LHC's Strategic Plan following extensive public consultation in 2010. The Commissioners believe that it is essential to reconfigure the visitor moorings in order to provide the type of mooring facilities expected by modern yachtsmen, and to maintain the vibrancy of the Town Quay area as a tourist destination.

The eight week consultation period commenced on Monday 1<sup>st</sup> August and ends on Sunday 25<sup>th</sup> September 2016. More details [here](#).

## Matilda Nicholls won the under 16 Girls Laser 4.7 European Championship

Matilda Nicholls won the Under 16 Girls Laser 4.7 European Championship at Crozon-Morgat in Brittany, France and finished in Bronze position at the Laser 4.7 U16 World Championship in Kiel, Germany.



## Royal Lymington girls strike Gold:

Vita Heathcote and Milly Boyle won the gold medal for the girls in the U17 fleet at the 420 European Championships on Lake Balaton last week. The Priestlands school pupils fought over 11 races against sailors from 23 countries, all of whom had been selected by their

home nation. "It was fantastic to win in such a competitive fleet", said Vita. "Balaton is such an amazing place to sail. It is always hot and the water is bright blue but it is really shifty and variable. I'm so pleased."

Although attendance was down on last year, the joint day sail with Cruisers and Scows to Hurst Spit was thoroughly enjoyed by all those who attended in some very pleasant if breezy summer weather. Three cruisers made their way to Hurst Spit and dropped anchor to be soon joined by four Scows and the Safety Rib. The Scows and the rib made fast to a selected Cruiser and went aboard to enjoy a very sociable lunch. All had a 'lively' sail back to Lymington in winds gusting F5 from the SW!

## Youth Week

The Commodore summed up the week:

Having been in the car park for the four gloriously sunny mornings during Youth Week helping to rig our grandchildren's boats, and then helping others who were struggling, I experienced a real sense of the occasion from the children's aspect and the volunteers. A number of the volunteers said, "do you think the children know how lucky they are to be part of Youth Week" the answer was invariably no but we all agreed that in later life they will reflect on this week and realise just how lucky they were. I know how much work and planning goes into Youth Week and I believe PRO Jenny Wilson and everyone involved should be justifiably proud of the week. Jenny's commitment over three decades to Youth Week has been unstinting. For over 25 years she has ensured the safety of our young competitors whilst delivering the best possible racing. # Juniors

## 420s

Lymington's 420s have had a very busy summer of racing. First up was the French Nationals at the endlessly sandy Trebeurden Bay, Brittany. Lymington's Pippa Cropley (with Hatty Morsley) pulled out all the stops to end up on the podium.

We then headed down to San Remo for the World Championships, with boats selected from more than 30 countries. The sailors were treated to some epic conditions which saw four Lymington based boats make the Ladies Gold fleet – so that if Lymington were a nation we would have come 2<sup>nd</sup> only to our hosts Italy! Pippa Cropley again lead the charge, only to be beaten in the end by older sister Jenny who now graduates on to the 470. Good luck Jenny and we'll look forward to seeing you on the big screen in 2020! Special mention to Ella Bennett and Emily Gent; when the going got tough (25 kts or more) they were peerless as they somehow torpedoed straight through the giant waves. Not all of the time though; rounding the windward mark in first place they drew loud applause from the assembled coach boats as they hoisted the kite. A few seconds later they drew more as the boat disappeared into the next wave, and soon emerged upside down! All was not lost for they won the next (and final) race.

Continuing in a south easterly direction the sailors were once again treated to some spectacular sailing conditions at the Junior (U19) European Championships on Lake Balaton, Hungary. Again the team fared very well, second only to Spain. Vita Heathcote/Milly Boyle were first girls in the U17 fleet.

A few boats then hopped over to Dublin for the Irish Nationals. Battle hardened from the Worlds, Charlotte Boyle/Georgia Baker showed the Irish girls how to do it with a string of excellent results in testing conditions.

Finally the British Nationals in Pwllheli, all except for the top boats (Pippa/Hatty and Ella/Emily) selected for the Eurosafs in Austria. This time Pippa Cropley held her form right to the end, discarding her 2<sup>nd</sup> places to win the gold medal as the Ladies 420 Eurosaf Champion!

The Nationals was a frustrating affair, with no wind all week until the final day, when we were hit by an unsailable gale!

Throughout all this the boys were hard at it too, with Lymington's Robbie King topping the Brits Open fleet) at the Worlds (25<sup>th</sup>) and the mixed fleet at the Europeans (13<sup>th</sup>). He then rounded off a terrific summer by winning the British Nationals.

### Spinnaker Non-Squad Winter Training

The non-squad winter training available at Spinnaker is now open, and is very popular so will probably fill up fast.

## RYA South Zone Qualifiers

If your child is thinking of applying for the South Zone Squad then:

1. Fill in the application form to be considered for Zone Squad, applications are now open via the RYA website.
2. Attend the Burghfield Open Meeting (South Zone Indicator), 3rd September, your sailor **must** race in **MAIN** fleet to be considered, sign up is via the IOCA website.
3. Attend the South/South West RYA Championships, 24th/25th September at Weymouth and Portland Sailing Academy, again your sailor **must** race in **MAIN** fleet to be considered, sign up is via the RYA website.
4. Attend the open training session at Spinnaker sailing club, 1st October.

## RYA/IOCA National/Intermediate/Development Squads

There are two remaining events for those wanting squad places this Winter:

1. Late Summer Championships at Hayling Island, 10th/11th September
2. End of Seasons Championships at Rutland Sailing Club, 8th/9th October

Entry for both these events are open and entry is via the IOCA website.
