CRUISING DINNER

The inclusive cost will be £6 per head, and if demand exceeds capacity a ballot for places will be held on 11th February. JUBILEE REVIEW

The Club has booked a steamer for the Jubilee Review on Tuesday 28th June. The tentative arrangements are that embarkation will be at the Club Pontoon at 10 a.m. and disembarkation at 7 p.m.

There will be a cash bar aboard and the inclusive price will be £10 per head, which will include luncheon appropriate to the occasion. There will be a limit of 180, so that firm bookings are required as soon as possible.

Those intending to use their own boats are requested to notify the following information to the Secretary before the 14th January. Name of boat, length overall and where the boat will spend the night of the 27th/28th June. This information is required by the Royal Navy who will allocate specific areas to individual Yacht Clubs.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The Annual General Meeting is at 5.30 p.m. on Saturday, 29th Janaury. The restaurant will be open for meals that evening.

SUBSCRIPTIONS

The subscriptions are due on 1st January and it is particularly requested that members pay promptly to avoid additional secretarial work involved in reminders.

PONTOON AND DINGHY PARK RENTALS

These too are due on 1st January and should be paid to the Secretary as soon as possible. The charges this year are as follows:-

over 10' £8 per annum

MOORING OF DINGHIES

It is a source of constant complaint that members use only the end of the pontoon to moor their dinghies and that the painters are too short. Painters should be at least 10' long and not more than 15' to enable others to manoeuvre easily.

There is always congestion at the pontoon and it would be much appreciated if those members who have marina berths would avoid leaving dinghies at the pontoon.

ENSIGNS AND BURGEES

Members are reminded of the guidance contained in the R.Y.A. Publication "Cruising C4/76" dealing with Flags and Signals for

owners who are members of more than one yacht club:

"If an owner is not a Flag Officer and he is a member of a yacht club in the port in which his yacht is lying, then he should use the ensign and burgee of that club.

If an Owner belongs to several clubs in one port, the ensign and burgee of the senior club should normally be used

There are certain clubs, such as the Service Clubs, the Royal Cruising Club, R.O.R.C. and Little Ship Club which are country wide and have no local affiliation. It is correct for an owner to use the ensign and burgee of any of these clubs of which he is a member whenever his yacht is in a place where there is no yacht club of which he is a member."

SUNDAY LUNCHEONS

The numbers taking Sunday lunch at the Club are steadily increasing, and the House Committee have introduced waitress service on Sundays for an experimental period. For the first week of the experiment a three course luncheon (including coffee) was provided at an inclusive cost of £1.75. As a result of comments made by some members who did not wish to have three courses, it is proposed to make the choice available so that members can order one, two or three courses, with or without coffee and pay the appropriate price.

REMOVAL OF PERIODICALS

It is sad to report that a number of periodicals and books have been removed from the Library over recent months. Members are reminded that periodicals and books should not be removed from the Library under any conditions.
