NEW MEMBERS' LIST

Enclosed is the up to date Members' List which has been prepared at no cost to members of the Club, but from the income received from the advertisements. It is hoped that members will support those who have advertised in the Members' List when the opportunity occurs.

DREDGING

The Harbour Commissioners are dredging the area of the Fortuna Dock a d the adjacent moorings to the East. The dredging is due to start in December. At the same time the Club intends to dredge the area of our pontoons. This will mean that the pontoons will have to be removed and there will therefore be no moorings available for dinghies or cruisers during the winter months. It is likely that the pontoons will be removed in January and will probably not be back in position until March. Members are requested to remove their dinghies from the pontoon as soon as possible and certainly before the end of December. Inevitably this will cause inconvenience to members, which is regretted, but which is inevitable if we are to get the dredging, which is highly necessary, done at the least cost to members.

USE OF PONTOON

Once again members' attention is drawn to the use of the pontoon. With the present number of members it is essential that users should show consideration to other members, ie. boats must not be left on the pontoon unattended and must never be left in the short stay berth for more than 15 minutes. At all times use of the pontoon should be limited to the shortest possible time so that other members are not inconvenienced. Members are asked not to leave dinghies afloat outside berthed yachts. Inside the pontoon please use long painters - at least 10-12 feet.

The Club has made a proposal to the R.Y.A. that scantlings should be prepared by Lloyds to enable G.R.P. 12 metre boats to be built. If the proposal is accepted, it is hoped that in due course, G.R.P. boats may be used in the challenge for the America's Cup, but in the mean time it is thought that class sailing in this excellent design may attract some owners who are disillusioned with IOR racing and other forms of handicap racing. STAFF FUND

Although it is some time yet before Christmas, this is the last mailing with which the reminder can be passed to members about the Staff Fund. INSTALLATION OF GAS CENTRAL HEATING

LOTTERY

The Club Lottery is still providing very useful income and a number of items which have generally benefitted the Club have been bought from Lottery funds. These include curtains in the Dining Room and Committee Room, carpet in the Committee Room, stools in the Bar, new table cloths and table mats for the Dining Room, new set of wine carafes and a new hoist, which is being constructed, for the Bar, and a number of other projects are being investigated. The Lottery costs £2 per month and there are monthly prizes of £50, £25, £15 and three consolation prizes of £5 each. These prizes will increase if membership increases. LECTURES

Accommodation at lectures is limited and members must book in advance either by telephone direct to the office or by entering their names on the list on the Notice Board.

SUPPERS

During the non-sailing season, ie. following the Potter Ship, the restaurant is only open in the evening for specific functions and members must book in advance. For a period this year the restaurant is also being opened on Friday evenings when a speciality menu will be served - details will be published weekly on the Notice Board.

SHORT OFFSHORE RACES

This Club is running a series of three short offshore races next summer for IOR and non-IOR yachts on 29th/30th June, 13th/14th July and 20th/21st July. The intention is that the races will start on Friday evening and finish on Saturday evening. It is hoped that members will support this series which we believe will fill a gap in the racing programme and cater for yachtsmen who wish to take part in an overnight race and also be able to spend a relaxing day on Sunday.
