CONGRESSIONAL CUP

On the 13th and 14th March, the Club is running the second of the Congressional Cup Series. This type of competition was originally run in America and this is the reason for the series being called the Congressional Cup Series.

Twelve f the most prominent helmsmen n the country are taking part and will all be sailing identically equipped Contessa 32's. The series is run on lines of an American tennis tournament with the helmsmen competing against each other. Each race consists of 2 boats and the starts are at 5 minute intervals throughout both days. It is one of the few yacht races which produces spectator appeal so that it is hoped that Members will take the opportunity to watch the series which will take place in the Solent in the vicinity of Lymington Spit. The courses consist of a windward leg of about 1 mile to a specially laid mark and then a run back to a leaward mark and a final beat back to the starting line.
