

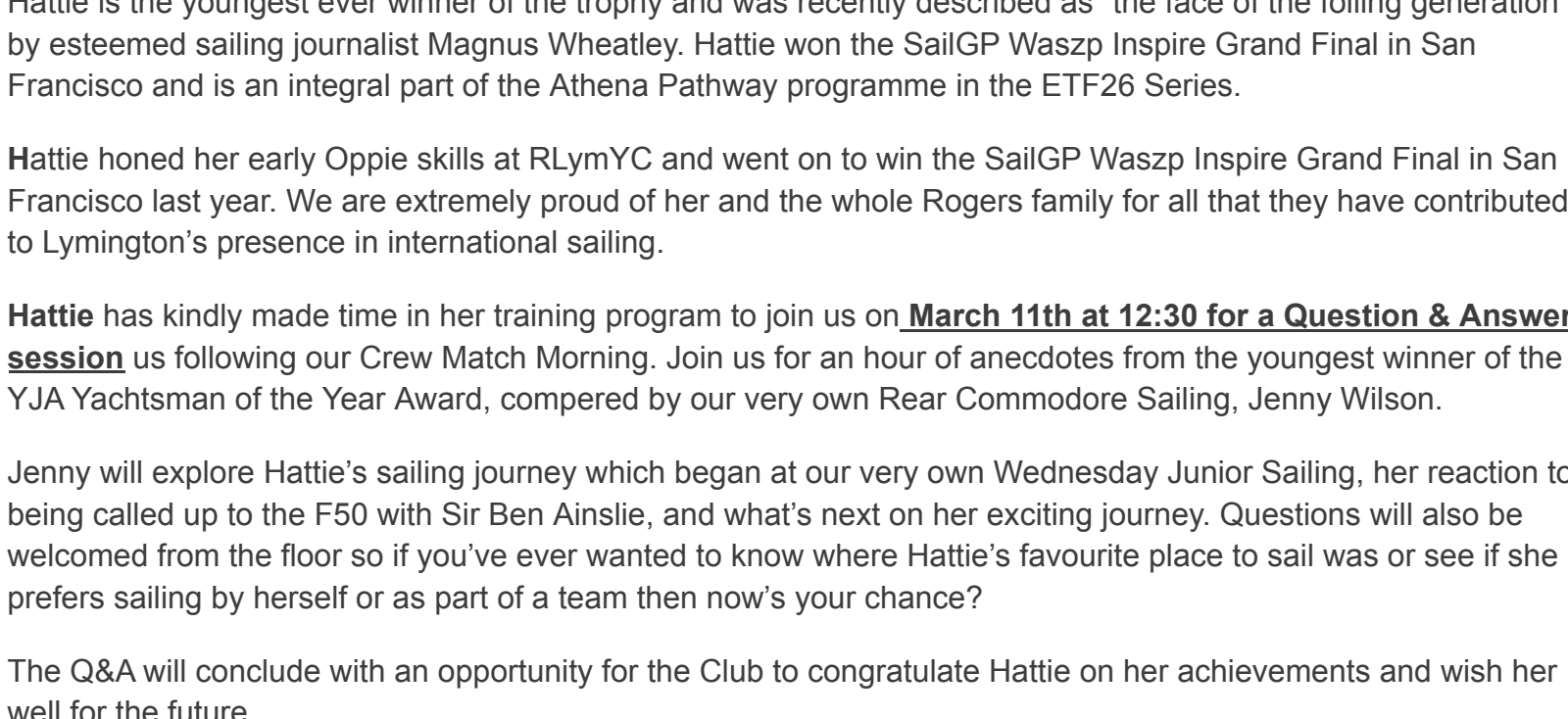

Yachting Journalists' Association Yachtsman of the Year 2023

Hattie was awarded this prestigious at the recent dinghy show where the trophy was presented by Olympic sailor Mike McIntyre MBE.

Hattie is the youngest ever winner of the trophy and was recently described as "the face of the foiling generation" by esteemed sailing journalist Magnus Wheatley. Hattie won the SailGP Waszp Inspire Grand Final in San Francisco and is an integral part of the Athena Pathway programme in the ET/26 Series.

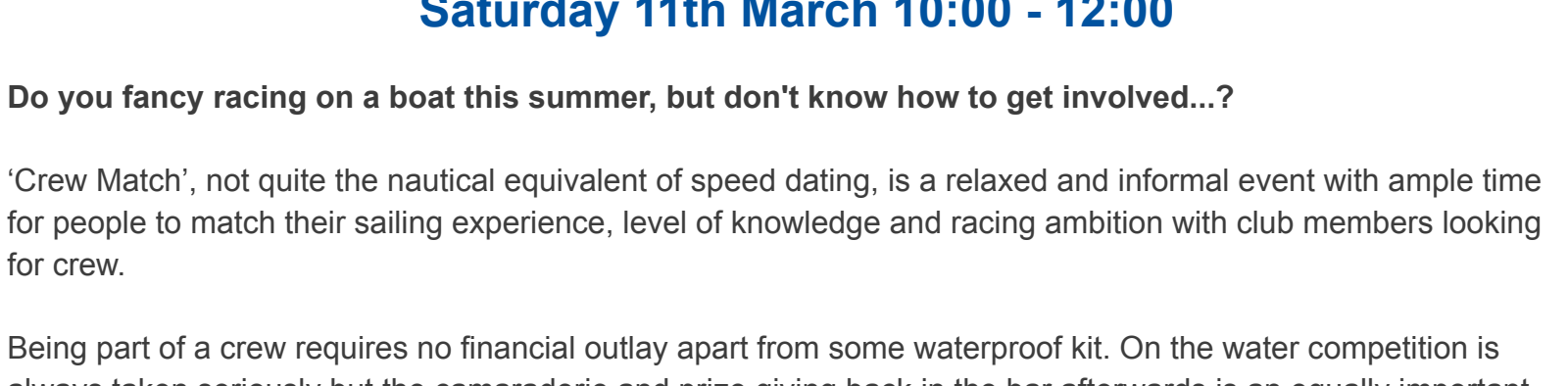
Hattie honed her early Ozzie skills at RLmYC and went on to win the SailGP Waszp Inspire Grand Final in San Francisco last year. We are extremely proud of her and the whole Rogers family for all that they have contributed to Lyminster's presence in international sailing.

Saturday 11th March 10:00 - 12:00

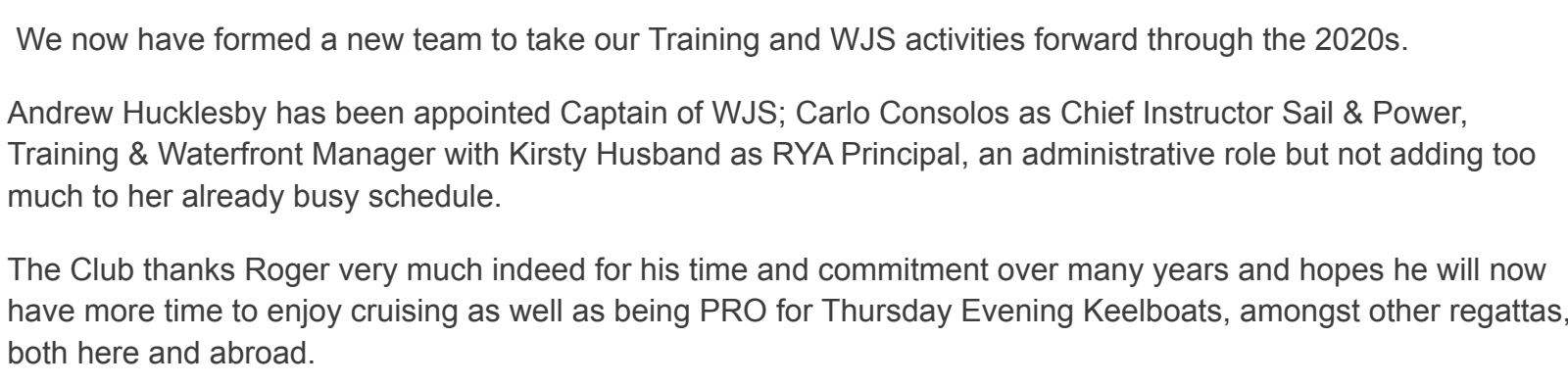
Do you fancy racing on a boat this summer, but don't know how to get involved...?

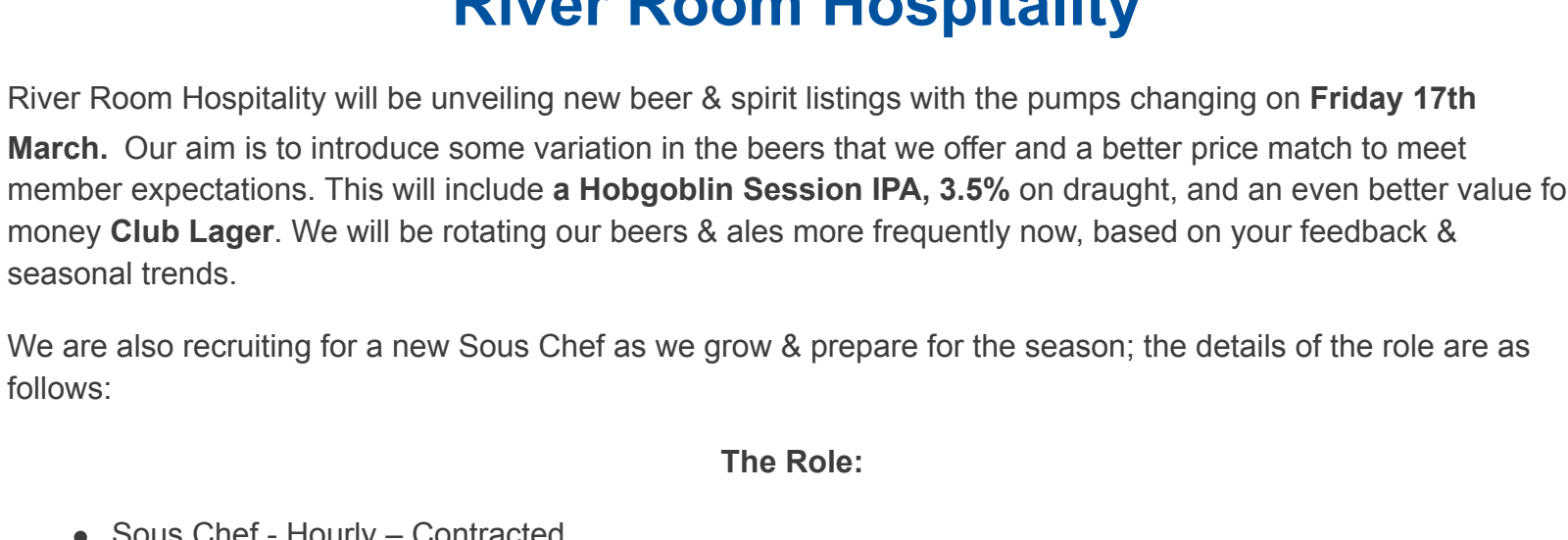
We now have formed a new Team to take our Training and WJS activities forward through the 2020s.

River Room Hospitality

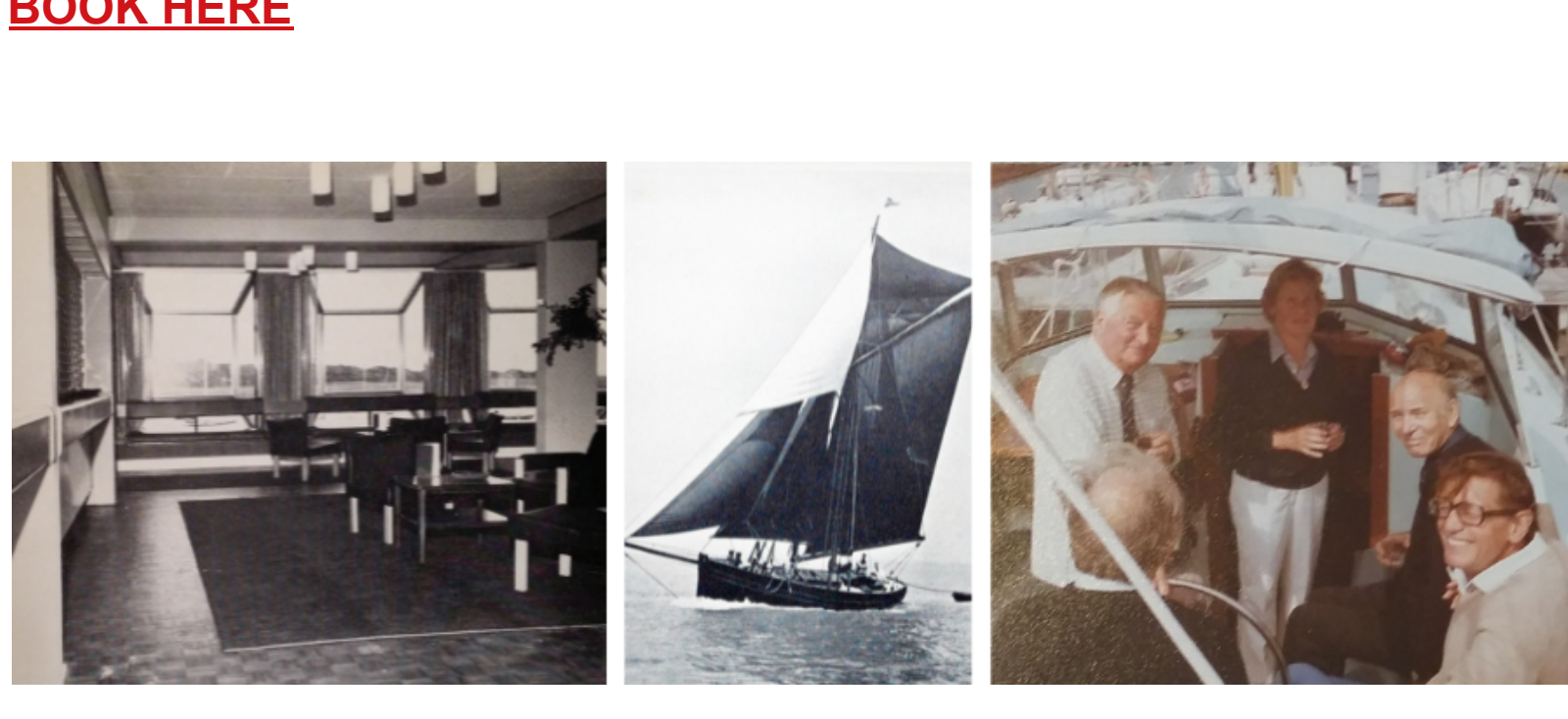

Our next Scow Winter Talk and Supper will be on Monday 20th March. Rory Paton will be talking about preparing for the scow sailing season with a Q&A session.

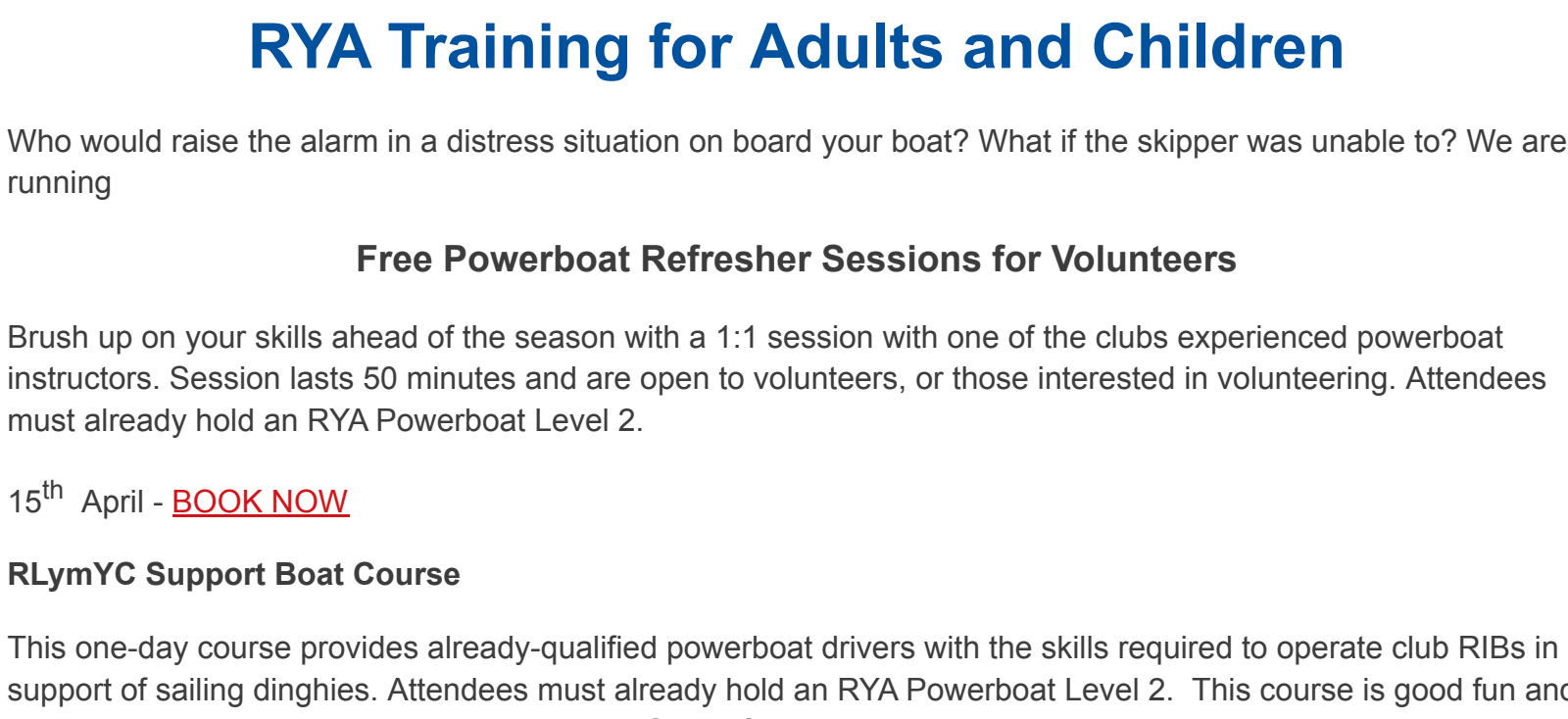

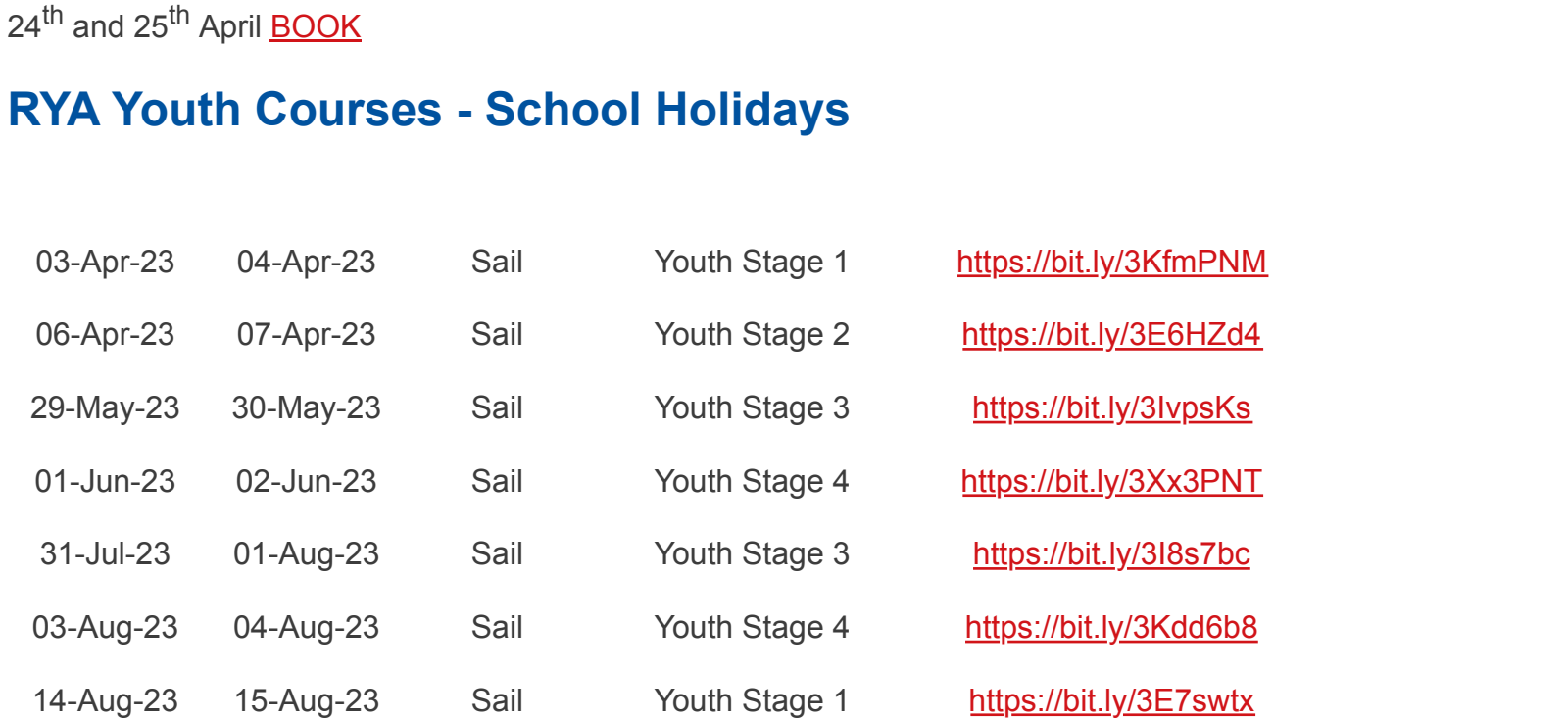

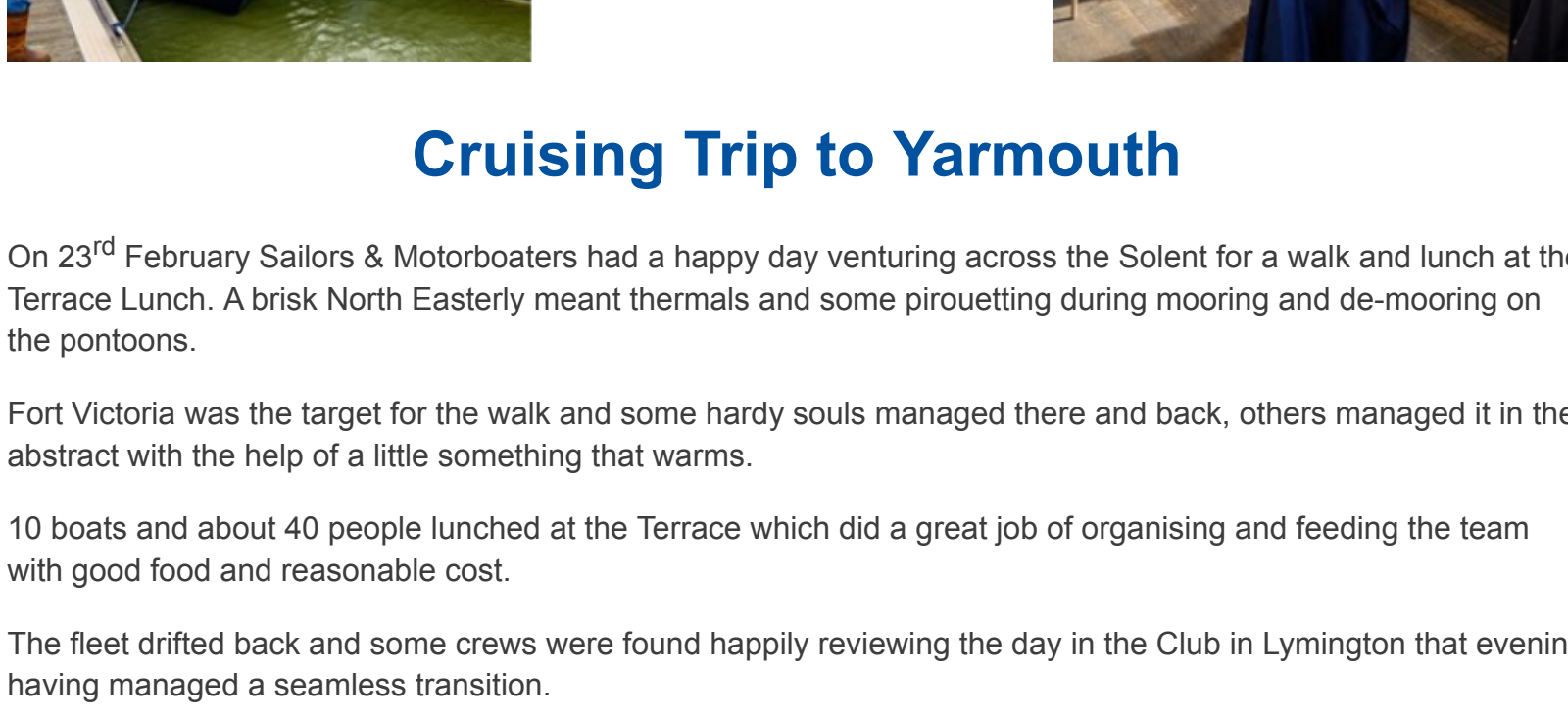
Powerboating Talk

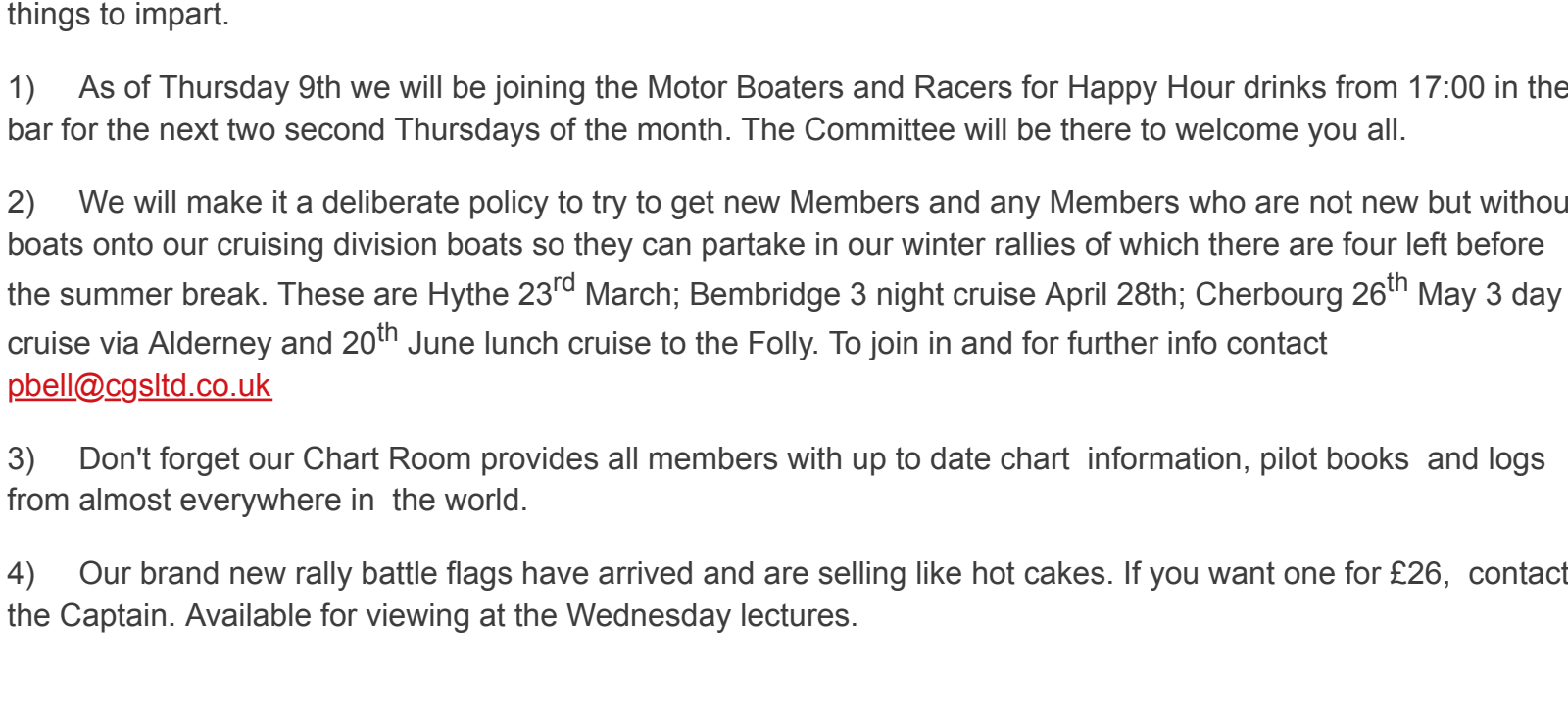

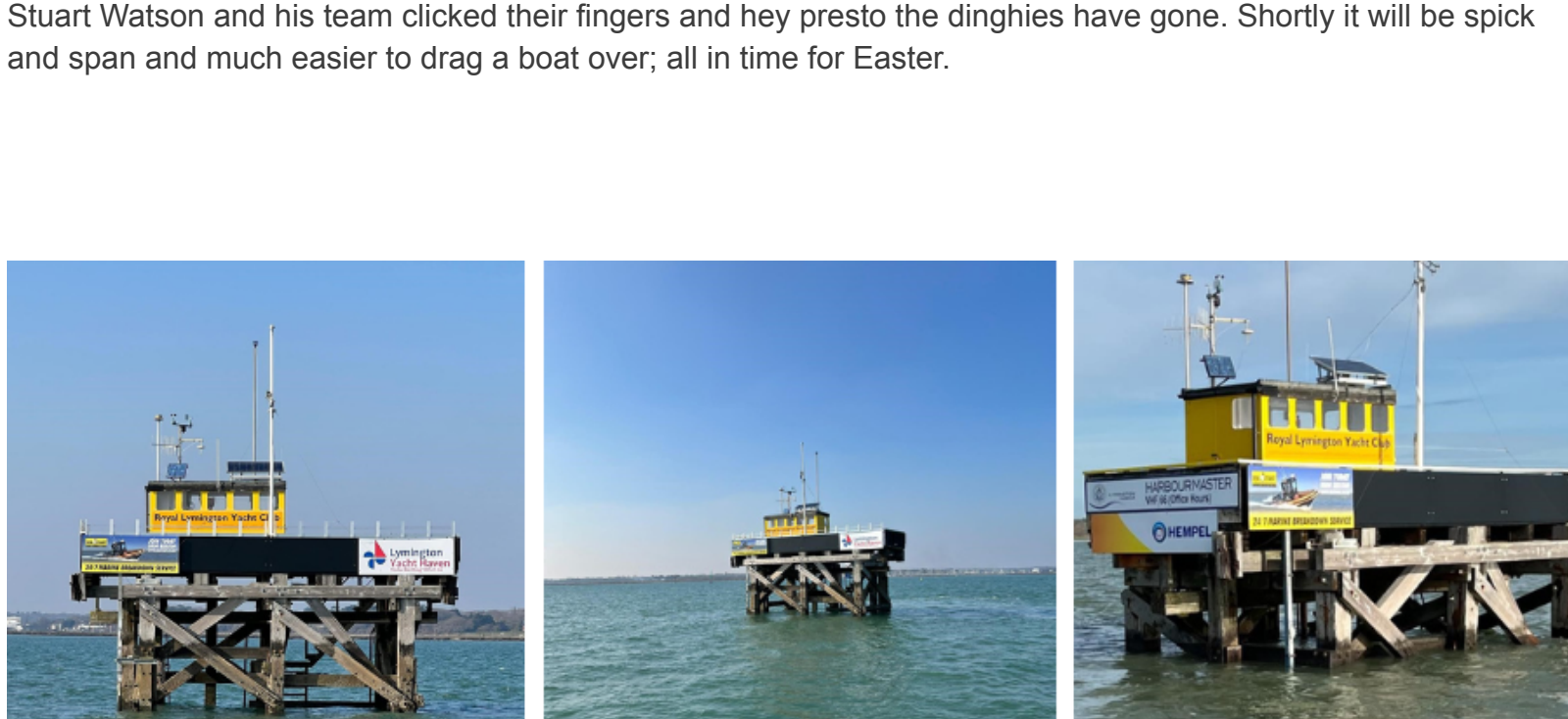


BRIDGE SUPPERS
