

Update to Members

The Flag Officers and Members of the Royal Lymington Yacht Club are deeply saddened by the passing of Her Majesty The Queen. Our thoughts and condolences are with our Patron, HRH The Princess Royal, and the entire Royal Family at this time of great loss.

As we navigate our way through this period of national mourning the Club has taken the decision to continue with scheduled activities, afloat and ashore, but in a respectful manner at all times. The bar and restaurant will remain open.

To mark the state funeral of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, the Club will be completely closed on Monday 19th September and there will no organised activities on this day. We will reopen on Tuesday 20th September at 08:00hrs

We've had a few members querying about how to fly their ensigns during this time. All official flags including the Union Flag and our Ensign, should be flown at half-mast until 08.00 the day following The Queen's State Funeral. Flags may be flown overnight during this period but should remain at half-mast. Half-mast means the flag is flown a third of the way down the flagpole from the top, with at least the height of the flag between the top of the flag and the top of the flagpole. Flags on poles that are more than 45° from the vertical, cannot be flown at half-mast and should not be flown at all.
