Photography Competition and Lecture Final

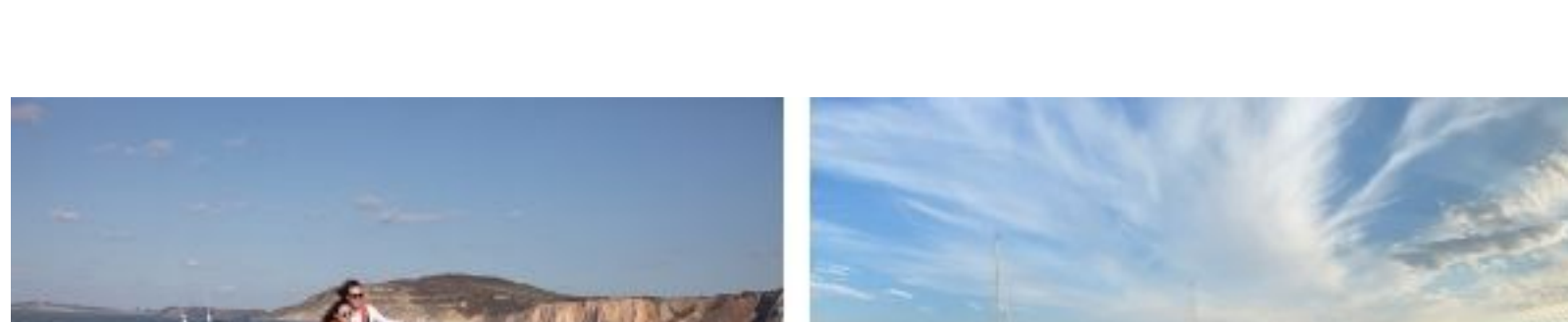
Book your seat for the final by Friday 7th January!

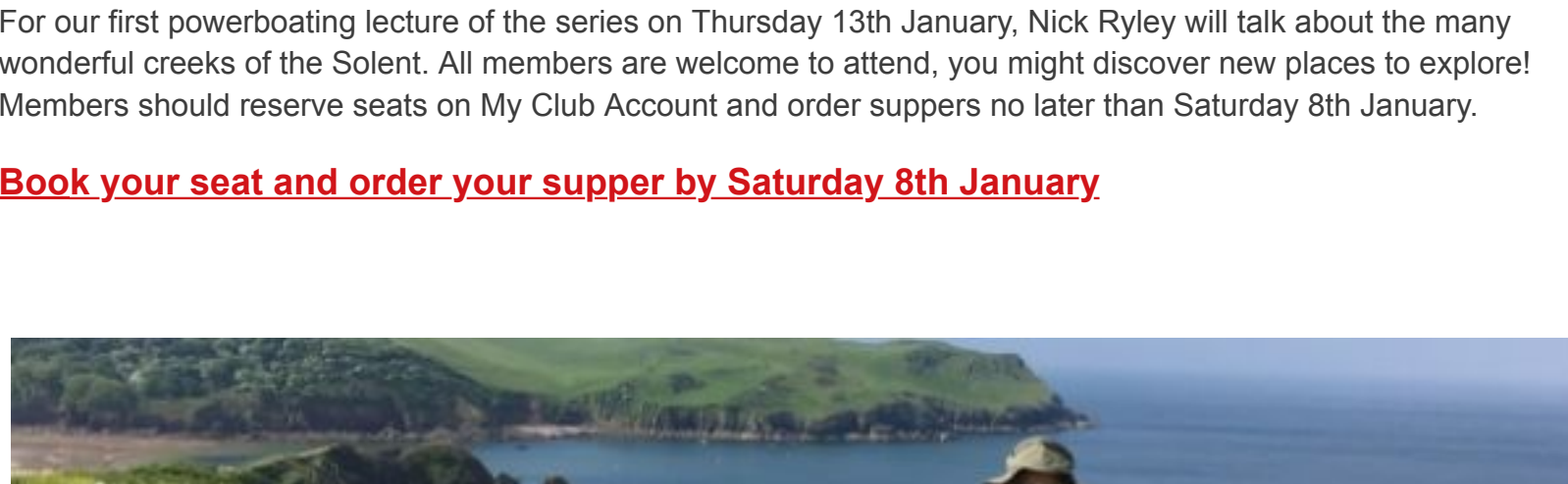


Powerboating Lecture: Creeks of the Solent

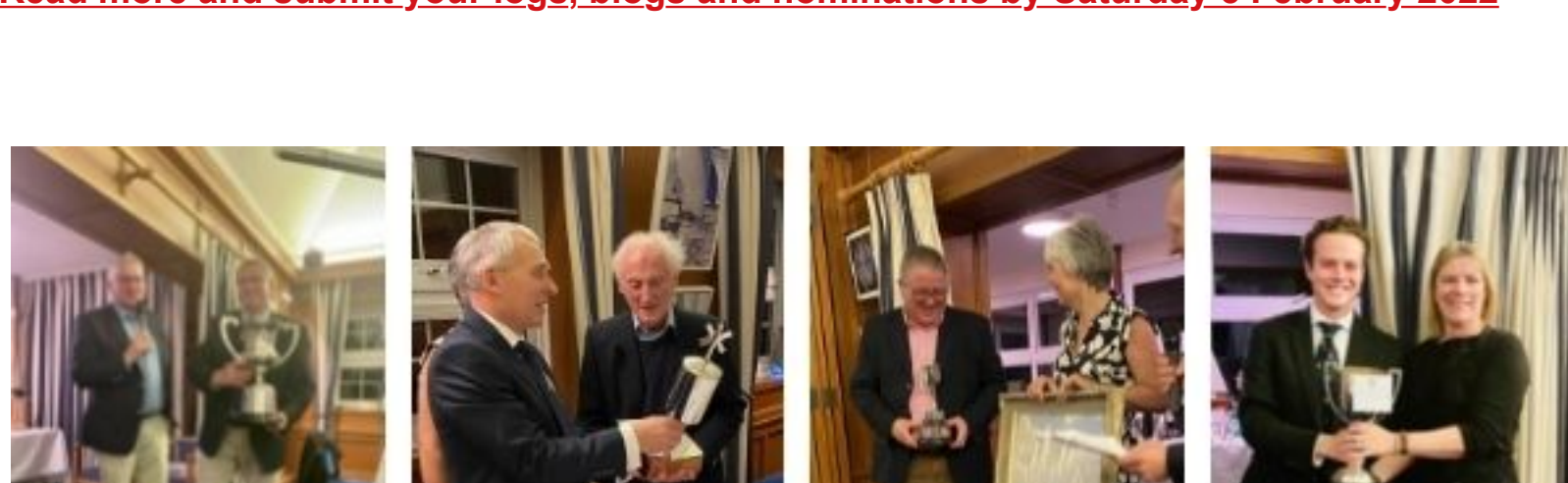


Submit your cruising logs and award nominations

A review of the 2021 XOD Season

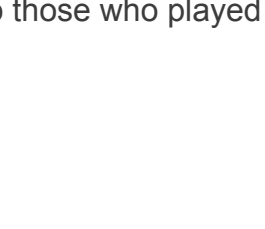

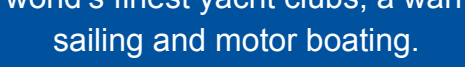
