#### **Engine Maintenance and Safety Morning**



This event is open to all members. New members are particularly welcome. No pre-booking or ticket is required.

Safety and a well-maintained boat will be at the top of the agenda for all who take to the water, whether it be sailing or motorboating. This event is designed to offer some essential advice to help equip you against some emergencies.

CLIVE ROCHFORT of Owen Haisell Services Ltd will speak about engine maintenance with advice on how to deal with common problems at sea and with Autumn on its way, some essential tips for winter lay-up.

STEVE BILLETT and DAVID MONKS, Water Safety Officers for the RNLI, will together first talk about the risks, prevention and possible remedies for dealing with fire on board at sea. This leads on to one of the principal reasons for abandonment and the complexities around the launching of a life raft.

Then, not to be missed, there will be a REAL-LIFE demonstration of a life raft launch off the club pontoon followed by a demonstration of the practical issues around recovering crew into the life raft.

We also have a suitably elderly and long overdue service life raft which has kindly been donated which will be put to the test. All of which will we hope will amplify why abandoning to life raft really is the point of last resort and encourage you to check your safety equipment servicing is bang up to date.
